DIRECT ACTION

"Get in or get out" is essentially what the government of British Columbia has said to the holders of timber limits in this northern country who will not, or who cannot, through force of circumstances, under-1 take the development of their holdings. This applies particularly with regard to the stand of spruce with which Central and Northern British Columbia is favored. An Orderin-Council was passed by the provincial authorities last week which effectively links up the activities of the Imperial Munitions Board with active cooperation of the provincial government. Under this order, the government has power to arrange with the Imperial Munitions Board to start immediately logging operations for the getting out of aeroplane spruce on all vacant areas of Crown land, and the holders of such are called upon to proceed with the necessary operations forthwith. If the holder of such lands fails to comply, the minister of lands has the right to make his own arrangements, in co-operation with the Munitions Board, with an equitable compensation with respect to the timber so cut.

This is getting down to business and cutting out of red tape. And action of this kind would be welcomed by the general public in many other lines as well. Where there is a lack of private enterprise, the government steps in. This is one of the few occasions where we find the government ahead of private enterprise, and leading the way. In fact, fulfilling its function, as this modern age demands. There already has been serious delay, so much so that the people of Vancouver have been up in arms at the apparent quiescence of Major Taylor of the Munitions Board there. upon it. And time is the essence of its production. So rather than waste time in negotiation with the holders of these spruce timber limits, the government has taken upon itself the powers for the immediate starting up of operations.

The spruce is here. It is required in Europe. The one thing to do is to get it where it is wanted, no matter who is the nominal owner. In time of national necessity that is the only logical thing to do. And the present government have done it. The Imperial authorities are asking for some thirty million feet per month, which is about fifteen times the amount of the average monthly output in this province.
