THE SPIRIT OF REVOLT

The example given by the Russian people during the early months of last year is having its due effect in the countries of her neighbors. While Russia itself is still torn with internal dissentions, and, according to dispatches received from Petrograd, which are as likely to be untrue as otherwise, fighting of a bloodthirsty character is still in progress throughout the length of the land, still the Russian revolutionists have found time and opportunity of spreading their propaganda both in Germany and in Austria Hungary.

The ideal of freedom for the individual is one which has been before the people of continental European countries for generations. Some of these peoples have achieved this ideal, or think they have, in greater measure, while others have made but little progress towards their goal, of which fact they are but too well aware.




