### TIME AND CHANCE

There are many of the residents of Prince Rupert, particularly those who have been here for more than the last five years, who are still buoyed up with optimism, for which there was such good grounds, that number of years ago. With discerning people, the longer they stay here, the greater the grounds they have for that optimism, which brought them here in the first place. They had every belief that this city was bound to develope and quickly, too, as a terminal city ought to be expected to. They still hold that belief, and now, after, in some cases, quite a period of that heart sickness brought about by "hope deferred," that belief seems about to be justified.

Justification of the faith in the quick progress of Prince Rupert has seemed at many times, especially within the last three years, notwithstanding INTENSIVE METHODS war conditions, or because of them, possibly, seemed to be at hand. But while there has been progress, it has been comparatively slow, and because of that not quite so apparent to the average citizen. However, the race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, but time and chance happeneth to all. Now seems to be the time when the chance is come, for a period of permanent development to the city, and to the surrounding district. Hardly ever before have the prospects seemed so bright for the immediate future.

In times past a favorite occupation was to build castles in the air, which after all is the proper place for such, only first of all, the foundations have to be evident. 




