

It is expected that in about three months from now there will be sufficient lumber coming into Prince Rupert for shipment to the east to make up a train load per day. It is expected that by next month, sometime, the new sawmill at Seal Cove will be operating, and there are several other mills, both on the Queen Charlotte Islands and on the Skeena which, one by one, will be adding their quota to the production of spruce lumber for aeroplane construction.

Such a large increase in traffic coming into Prince Rupert will necessarily require much greater facilities for handling it than at present exist, and already the G. T. P. are laying tracks alongside the wharf whereby this lumber may be loaded direct from the scow to the car as quickly as it can be handled. The programme of the G. T. P. also includes additional wharfage to take care of this trade, and which will undoubtedly be necessary before the year is out.

This additional traffic will mean a very great deal to the railway company. When it is GOING AHEAD FURTHER considered that one additional freight train per day going east also means one additional train of empty cars, although not necessarily empties either, coming west, and the necessary additional accomodation, both in yardage and shops and staff, it hardly needs to be pointed out that there will also necessarily be considerable development along the grade. This great increase in the 'lumber business means a large increase in other directions as well. The different outfits operating all need supplies in food, clothing, material, etc., which will also require transportation, while at the same time the volume of passenger traffic is bound to increase.

That business which war orders brought to the other parts of the Dominion since 1914 is just now beginning to affect this far West. It has taken a long time to come, but there seems to be this about it, dif-


