HUMBUG

The origin of this word humbug is unknown, but its meaning is the same today as it has been for many years. The word is used both as a verb and as a noun, and the letter recently received by his worship Mayor McClymont from the Honorable Minister of Marine and Fisheries at Ottawa on the subject of the fishery regulations and the amendments thereto desired by the fishermen of this District No. 2, might be taken as a good example. It is a concrete representation of the abstract principle, or lack of principle, some might call it.

A week ago tonight, Mayor McClymont received the Honorable Minister's letter, a belated response to his telegrams. In it the minister stated that the meeting of the fishermens' unions here were laboring under some misapprehension, but in this the honorable minister is apparently wrong, judging by the information he handed out the very next day to the press. The Honorable Minister considered that until he had received the full report of the special Royal Commission on the subject of fisheries, that it would be on his part "the better part of wisdom" that no action be taken by him with regard to local conditions, until this final report of the Commission was received. Yet within a few days of writing these words, he publishes his decision that no gas boats be permitted to fish with gill nets on the Skeena.


