The immediate necessity for conscription or compulsory service was impressed upon the people, to the total exclusion of all other considerations. And by the depriving of a large number of Canadian citizens of their votes, and the withholding of the right of the majority of the women of Canada to cast their ballots, the Union Government was returned. But although the Military Service Act has been in force for many months, there is so far not one single man overseas where they are so urgently ZIONISM. required, nor are there anything like the hundred thousand men called up.

have. This sale of War Bonds, too, is all the more remarkable, coming as it does, after the phenomenal success which attended the movement of the "Tanks" throughout the length of the land last month. "Tank" weeks were held in all the larger cities and towns there, when War Bonds were sold to the people in enormous quantities. Millions of pounds, not dollars, were subscribed each week on the arrival of the Tanks, and there was quite some rivalry. among the towns in England. Birmingham beat all the others there by subscribing over £6,-000,000 or \$30,000,000 during the stay of the Tank in that city. But when "Julian" as this tank was named, left Glasgow, it had sold over £14,000,000 worth of War Bonds, or nearly half the amount asked for the Canadian Victory Loan.
