## MPERIAL MEASURE IS CANADIAN STANDARD

Ottawa, April 5 .- A ruling by he Canadian Inland Revenue authorities makes the use of the United States liquid measure illegal in Canadian trade. The United States gallon is approvimately 20 per cent. smaller than the Dominion gallon; more exactly, the imperial gallon in use in Canada is equal to 1.2009 United States gallons. Many complaints have been made in Canada as to the sale of bottled and tinned goods, such as ink, essences, condiments and paints, put up by American houses according to the United States or wine measure unit. American goods measured by the smaller unit have an unfair advantage over similar Canadian goods.

Goods in packages and containers may be put up and sold without any reference to the measure of the contents, or the contents may be indicated by weight in pounds or ounces, but if any reference whatsoever is Mineral made to the contents by measure Canal Mining it must be in Dominion measure






