U. S. LINER ST. PAUL OVERTURNS IN DOCK

An Atlantic Port, April 26 .-The American line steamship St. Paul, famous passenger, liner, overturned and sank at her pier here today while being warped into a pier preparatory to loading for a trip to Europe. Three men probably lost their lives in the accident.

At the time the St. Paul was not under steam, but was being brought by tugs from a drydock, where for the last week she had been undergoing repairs. On her at the time were several hundred men, a majority of them employees of the drydock, who had been sent with the vessel to complete their work while she was being loaded. The steamer now is lying on her port side with about ten feet of her hull amidships above the water, and is completely submerged both fore and

Conspicuous among these was the legislation affecting the logging of spruce for aeroplanes. LOGGING PROGRESS ON MASSET INLET

As the result of aeroplane spruce operations in the Queen Charlotte district, a fair sized town has been developed on Buckley Bay, an arm of Masset Inlet, on Graham Island. This town will be the working centre of the Masset Timber Co., of which Mr. F. L. Buckley is president and general manager.

The company is now installing at the point a mill with a capacity of 200,000 feet per day on a twoshift run. Construction work is now well advanced and the mill will be in operation during June.

About a thousand men will be employed, who, with their families and tradesmen, will make up a good-sized settlement. A post office has already been arranged for at the point, which is on the north side of the Inlet, directly opposite Port Clements.

The logging operations in the limits adjacent to the mill will take a good proportion of the total number of men employed The mill will cut spruce from what is probably the finest spruce tract on the coast, it being estimated that there are 500,000,000 feet available. The timber is probably the best anywhere on a tract of the same size.


