London, May 16 .- A correspondent writing of conditions obtaining at present in Russia says that May Day was a notable celebration throughout Russia by the Soviets. The Soviet proclamation declared the day doubly important as it also marked the end of the six months of the Workmen's government in Russia, and the firm establishment of Soviet power.

The Moscow celebration centred about the Red Square, adjoining the Kremlin, where the victims of the October revolution are buried. Probably 100,000 working men and women of the various unions. bearing gigantic red banners, proclaiming international Socialism, and extolling the Soviet govermment, marched through the streets and passed in review before the members of the Central Government grouped about the graves of the revolutionists. Thousands of sailors and soldiers, representing all services of the Red Military Establishment. participated in the parade and patrolled the streets. Perfect
