On 25,000 tons the saving in freight over water charges to the East would, it is estimated, be more than a quarter of a million dollars, and over rail rates, by which route it would probably have to go, the saving would be about half a million.

It also means speedier deliveries and returns. The prediction is made that very little of the Hawaiian sugar will this year go to the Eastern refineries.

#### FOOD AND TREASON

Food Controller Thompson says it is little short of treason to ignore the object and spirit of the food regulations-

By what judgment he judges the Food Controller must expect to be judged.

If it is little short of treason to ignore the object and spirit of the food regulations, how much less "short of treason" is it to frame food regulations which subserve the "object" of saving food to the "spirit" of private greed?

If it is near treason to eat wheat, beef and pork instead of substitute foods, how much is it less akin to treason for a food controller to allow profiteens to boost the prices of substitute foods to such heights that the public are discouraged. or even prevented, from eating them?

If it is something resembling treason to waste a scrap of meat in the kitchen or at the table, how much less does it resemble treason to allow cold storage companies to destroy car loads of meat by avoidable "accidents" and send it to the incinerator?

The food control department has been administered consistently on the assumption that the Canadian people are wealthy enough to eat what they please and wasteful enough to throw away what they ought to eat.





## FOR SUBMARINES

London, May 18 .- The British Admiralty restriction on navigation in the northern part of the North Sea, in view of the laying of a great mine field for the purpose of foiling submarines, became operative today, and hereafter all shipping in that area must comply with stringent regulations or ignore them at their own risk. After dark no ship will be allowed within the prescribed area, which lies between the coasts of Norway and Scotland and any vessel finding itself there, half an hour after sunset, must anchor in accordance with the Admiralty's directions. The regulations include strict rules affecting all except warships entering and leaving the ports of Northeastern Scotland as well as the Orkney and Shetland Islands.

The vast barrier, which seems to have been over-estimated in extent in earlier reports, is now said to cover approximately 22,-000 square miles.






