throwing of overwhelming masses of troops against the thinly-held Allied lines, the Germans have been enabled, by paying a big enough price in casualties, in making little better than an advance of ten miles right in the centre of a front of some thirty-five miles. Along this front at places the Allies have given ground before the weight and momentum of the German blow but taking their toll as they retired. This new battle front lies immediately south of the line from which the Germans ECONOMY advanced on their way towards Amiens. Their success on this occasion, which so far has been denied them, would place them on the road to Paris via the valleys of the Ourcq and Marne rivers.

The weight of the enemy attack has resulted in the capture of some fifteen thousand prisoners. Berlin has since then augmented this number by another ten thousand, which has not yet been confirmed. This number of men, in itself, would seem to be a loss of some importance to the Allies, but in the thinly-held front lines, this loss is possibly one of the unavoidable things connected with modern warfare. The enemy losses are already reported as heavy, and it may be assumed that for the fifteen thousand prisoners the Allies have lost, a very much greater proportionate loss has been suffered by the advancing Germans. The policy of attrition adopted by the Allies is being followed logically. And one thing to be remembered is that Germany is in a worse position to bear great losses in manpower than are the Allies.

In the opinion of competent military authorities, the German offensive will be definitely stopped by this evening, by the reserves being brought up to stiffen the Allies' lines. The enemy is close enough to Paris and in Flanders close enough to the Channel ports already, and the time is at hand when there is no possibility of allowing him any more latitude in his advance. The initiative will

then be up to General Foch. MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1917

DUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that, by the effect of the regulations of the Governor General of Canada in Council of the 20th of April, 1918, and the Proclamation of 4th May, 1918, recently published, every male British subject resident in Canada, born on or since the 13th of October, 1897, who has the appropriate Registrar or Deputy Registrar of any attained or shall attain the age of 19 years and change of residence or address. who is unmarried or a widower without children must, (unless he is within one of the classes of persons mentioned in the schedule of Exceptions to the Military Service Act) report as hereinafter directed on or before the 1st day of June, 1918, or within ten days after his 19th birthday, whichever date shall be the latter.

Such report must be in writing and must give his name in full, the date of his birth and his place of residence and also his usual post office address.

The report must be addressed to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar under the Military Service Act of the Registration District in which he resides (see below) and shall be sent by registered post, for which no Canada postage is required.

Young men so reporting will not be placed on active service till further notice. They must, however, notify

On receipt of the report an identification card will be forwarded by the Registrar which will protect the bearer

Punctual compliance with these requirements is of great importance to those affected. Failure to report within the time limited will expose the delinquent to severe penalties and will in addition render him liable to immediate apprehension for Military Service.



Invites the Co-Operation of the Public on Behalf of the Banks

Staffs Heavily Reduced by War

NORE than half the men in the banks of Canada are now on military service, and the number which remains is being steadily reduced.

Women clerks have been employed in thousands and have done splendidly, but they have not the experience of the men they replace. It would be out of the question to expect them to work as rapidly or with the same knowledge of banking as officers of many years training in the profession.

The drain upon the number of experienced officers has new reached a point where it is necessary to ask the public to take into consideration this decrease in efficiency, and to lighten, as far as they can, the burden thus thrown upon those left to run the business. Canada was never so busy as now and the volume of banking business is greater than ever before.

How the Public Can Help

Transact your banking business in the morning as far as possible, and as early as possible. Try to avoid a rush at closing time.

Do not draw any more cheques than are absolutely necessary. Instead of paying small accounts by cheque, draw the money in one amount and pay in cash.

Change in Banking Hours June 1st.

On and after June 1st banking hours will be: 9.30 to 2.30; Saturdays 9.30 to 12.00.

This arrangement will give the staff more time to complete the large amount of work which cannot be taken up until after the office is closed to the public.

Special Services Discontinued July 1st.

Certain services must of necessity be discontinued, for a time at least.

On July 1st banks will discontinue receiving payments for tax bills and the bills of gas, electric and other public service corporations.

The banks desire to render all essential services including many special ones arising out of the war. In order to do this they make this appeal for co-operation in the manner suggested above
