He will be matched against the Shaughnessys, the Burys, the Halls, and other railway giants. The Canadian Pacific and the State - owned transcontinental system will be rivals on a grand scale. That by so registering you will almost certainly be saving yourself great inconvenience on Registration Day.


That every registration taken beforehand is so much of the job done—so much of the load lifted from the overburdened registrar-so much congestion avoided.
