In spite of the known resources to the north country the Premier himself desires to know exactly what the conditions are, what methods may be introduced to secure the fullest possible expansion from railway development completed and projected.

One of the prominent factors of the situation in the Peace River country is that its trade is now going to Edmonton. This is a phase of the question which is of considerable concern to the province, and means for a remedy will form no small part in any programme which may result by rea-
