### HOURS FOR BANKING CHANGT THIS MONTH

Handicapped by the great loss of experienced officials, Canadian banks have taken the first step towards increasing their efficiency by changing the banking hours and discontinuing certain special banking services, such as receiving payments for tax, gas and electric light bills-

For the purpose of giving the bank staffs more time to complete the large amount of work that h grown out of the war, and that has made the volume of banking business greater than ever before, after the first of June, the banking hours will be 9:30 to 2:30 on five days a week, and 9:30 to 12 on Saturdays.

Believing that the public will help as far as possible in assisting the banks to carry on the business, handicapped as they are by their splendid contribution to the forces overseas, some of the bank managers have been asked] for some suggestions as to how the customers of the banks might co-operate with the staffs. It was felt that if the necessity were shown, the public would be only too glad to help in every way possible.
