Give Evidence Before Marine Court—Kelly and Commodore Involved.

T. H. Johnson, manager of the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Company, accompanied by Capt. Hills, late of the "Kelly," and Chief Engineer Strombahl, left for Vancouver by the Prince Rupert last evening, in connection with an action pending in the Marine Court there.

It will be remembered that about November last the steam fishing boat Kelly picked up the tug Commodore with a barge of copper ore in tow off Yakatat, on the Alaskan coast. The Commodore was bringing the scow load of copper south for smelting and
