Health Department Being Established.

The establishment of a Public Health Department in connection with the Dominion Government is something that has been strongly advocated for many years by people who had the welfare of the country at heart. The great thing will be for the Government to see that it becomes effective. To establish the department is a small-matter; to get it to work and have it perform the duties expected of it is quite another matter.

For years past the charge has been made against both the Provincial and Dominion Governments that the Governments paid more attention to the breeding of cattle and caring for their health than they did for the health of the people. Often there was truth in the allegation. If the Dominion Government really mean making a change in policy in that regard they will be deserving of credit.
