## (Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)

Paris, April 10.-The responsibility of the German Emperor the war and the means for bringing him to trial by one of the lied Governments, probably Belgium, has been definitely demined upon by the Council of Four. This follows a definite cision on the terms of reparation for war damages whereby five lion dollars must be paid within two years, and the inter-Allied mmission will assess the remaining damage for a period of irty years, beginning May 1, 1921.
