The Housing Committee of the City Council have prepared regulations under which soldiers and their dependents may obtain home building loans in connection with the Federal and Provincial Better Housing Scheme. These regulations consist of some seventeen clauses, and are general regulations and, of course, subject to modification to meet special cases should there be any
