



## The Letter Box

MUNICIPAL AFFAIRS

Editor, Daily News:-

At the present time there seems to be a considerable stock-taking in various governmental affairs and one finds some rather interesting opinions expressed bearing on this subject.

A writer in a financial paper, commenting on the evil of government borrowing, says:

"For a private person or concern to be making up for falling revenues by repeated borrowings, thus increasing the annual expense, the only end would be naturally assumed as bankruptcy. The prevailing notion is that governments are bound to keep borrowing until times become normal again and must then pay off their debts. But the serious evil at present is that this borrowing is acting as a hindrance to the arrival of what is called normalcy. Prosperity must come, if at all, by the opposite proceeding. Some other cause may give a turn for the better, but government borrowing is a hindrance to be overcome. And until governments cease borrowing the outlook is discouraging.'

In my opinion this applies equally to cities and municipalities as well and coming closer home I have our own city in mind. It is true that we are now reaping what we in years past have been sowing, by having to freely have spent. I firmly believe this can be accomplished—if proper economies are practiced by our city council. But as things are pointing just at present it is a question just how long the tax payers can bear the burden.


