## Fifteen Little Girls Will Get Beautiful Christmas Presents in Ormes Drug Store Doll Contest

Little girls are already looking longingly into the window of Ormes Drug Store where 15 beautiful dolls, one doll's trunk and three doll carriages are on display. The dolls, the trunk and carriages are the prizes to be given away in connection with a contest commencing next week-end and carrying on until Christmas Eve. The awards will be made Christmas morning at 10 o'clock.

The dolls are most attractive and the carriages just the kind that little girls like. They are valued at from \$1.25 up to \$16.50 each and are to be given away. For each cent spent at the store between November 19 and the evening of December 24 each customer gets one vote. One hundred votes for a dollar. These votes can be given to any little girl under 12 years of age and the girls getting most votes will get the prizes, one for each. The purchaser of the goods writes on the ballot the name of the girl he or she wishes to vote for.

Nominations commence Monday morning, November 14, and each girl nominated gets 100 votes with nomination papers. Any girl in the city under 12 years of age may be nominated.

Of course every little girl in the city will want a doll or a carriage. She has a chance of getting one of these if she is not over 12 years of age and if she can induce enough people to vote for her. She must not canvas for votes in the store but may do so anywhere else. Ballot blanks must not be taken from the store and every ballot must be stamped by the proprietor or one of his assistants. No ballot may be placed in the box before November 19 or after 10 o'clock Christmas Eve. Ballots will be given out only at

time of sale of the goods. Any ballots showing any trace of change in the number of votes marked will be destroyed and cannot be counted. In the event of a tie for any prize offered, a prize identical with that tied for will be awarded to each tying contestant.

The great thing about this contest is to start early. Any little girl in the city has a chance to win. The thing for her to do is to interest friends in the contest and get them to write her name on the ballot papers when they buy anything in the store. One dollar spent in the store entitles the purchaser to one hundred votes. Remember, the contest starts next Saturday and continues until 10 o'clock Christmas Eve.

(By Capt. Ruby Steele, Salvation Army)

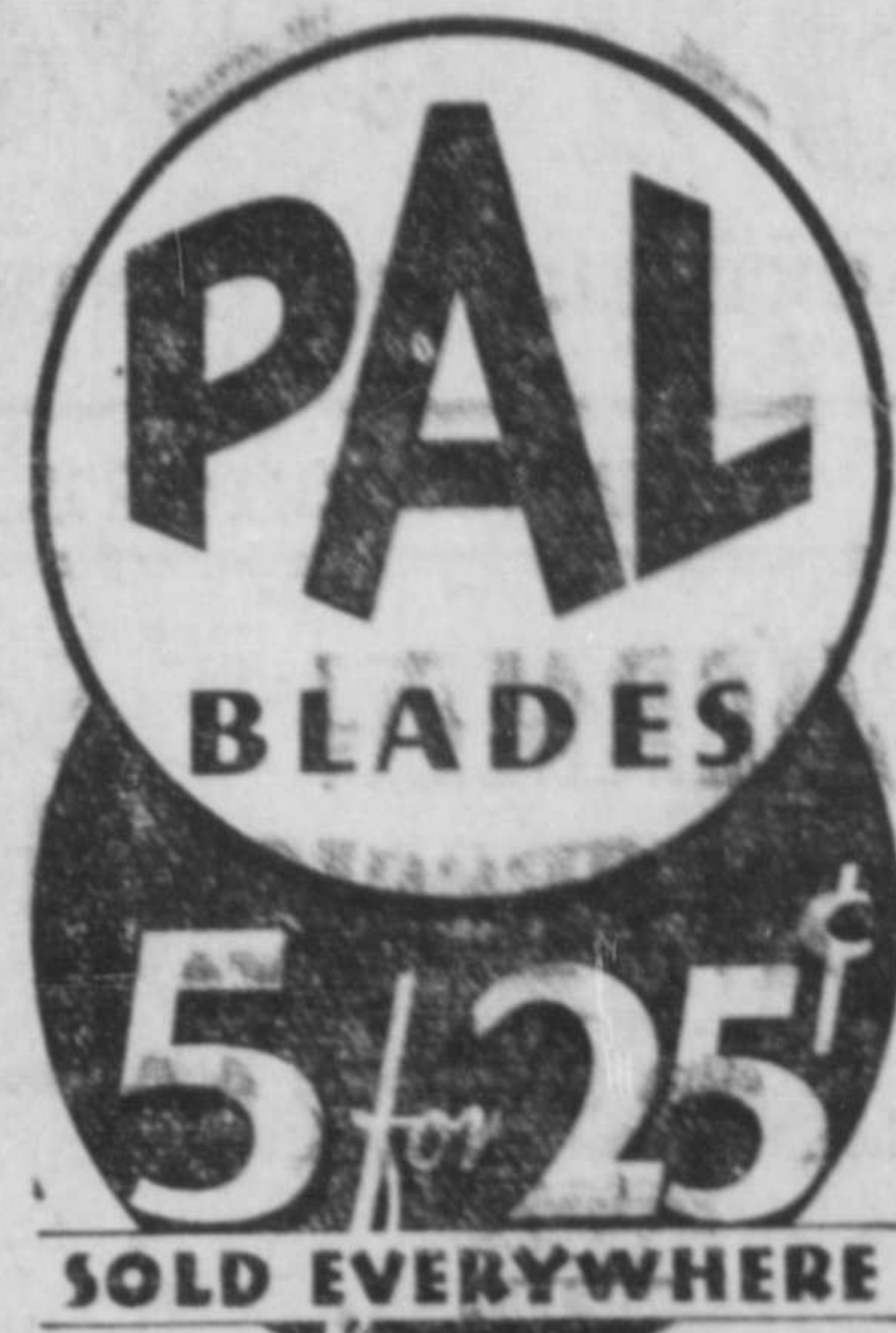
Isaiah 63:3: "I have trodden the winepress alone." 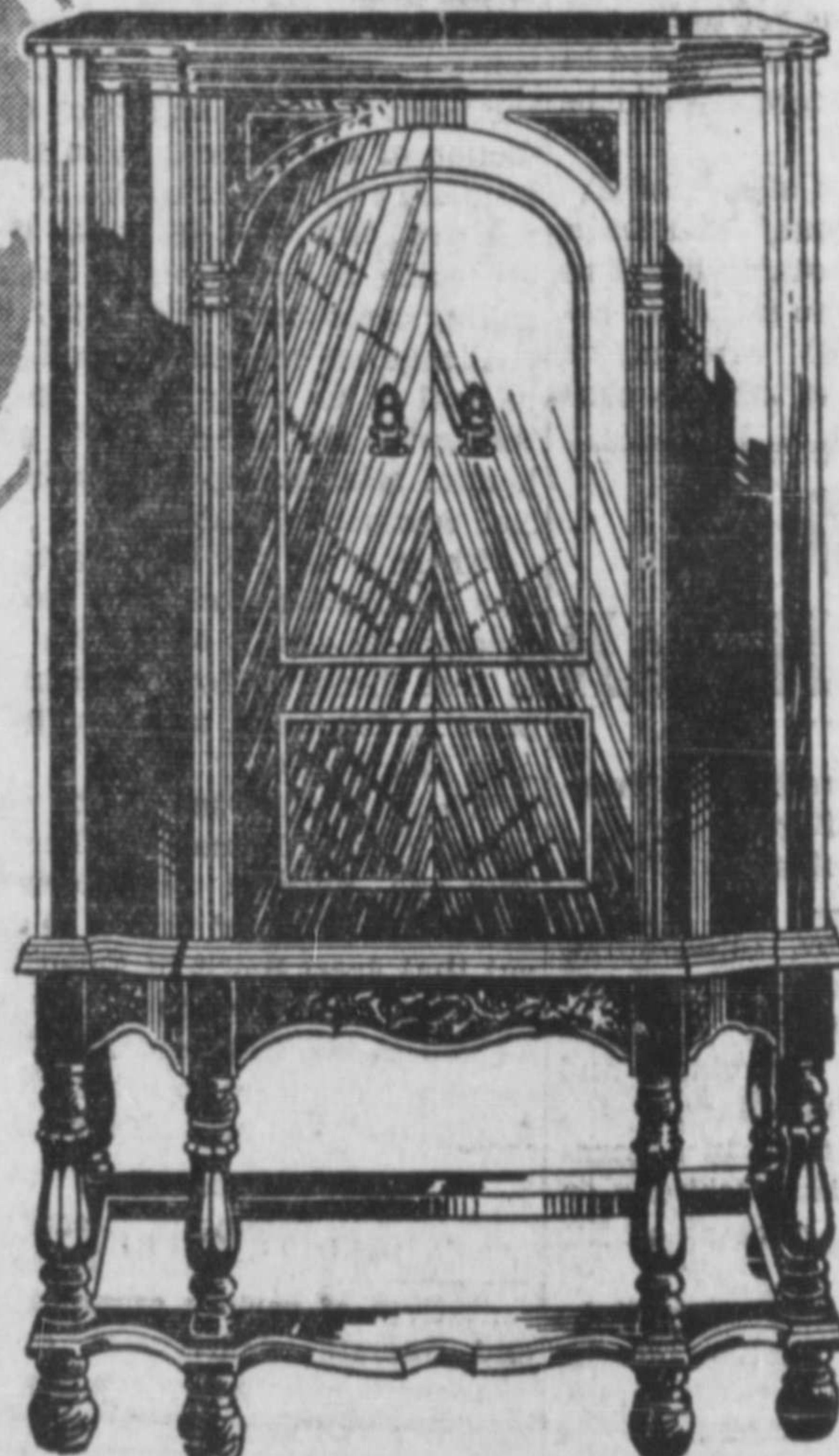

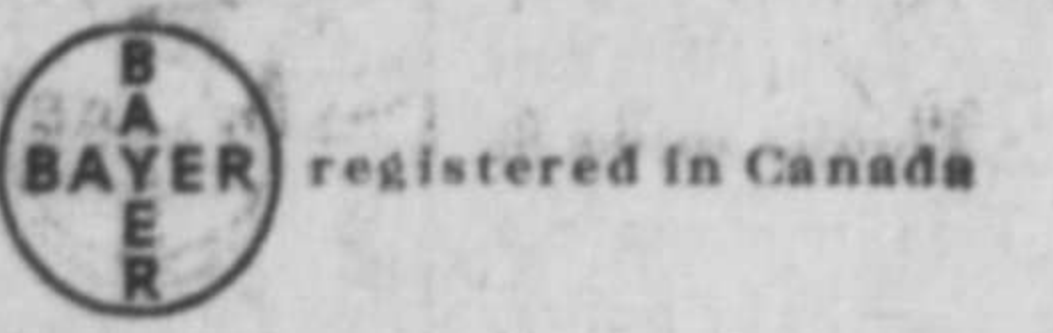

## WATERFRONT WHIFFS

**American Halibut Landings Ahead of Last Year—Some Individual Records—The Salmon Pack**

The grand total of halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert for the 1932 season was 14,650,350 pounds as compared with 16,036,940 pounds in 1931, 24,638,000 pounds in 1930, 27,807,250 pounds in 1929, 27,036,000 pounds in 1928 and 25,135,950 pounds in 1927. American landings for the season just ended totalled 10,508,100 pounds which was a slight increase over the 10,339,140 pounds of 1931 although far behind 18,192,500 pounds in 1930, 20,354,500 pounds in 1929 and 19,554,700 pounds in 1928. As previously reported the grand total of Canadian landings for this year was 4,142,250 pounds as compared with 5,697,800 pounds in 1931.

For the American fleet, the Ketchikan schooner Rainier, Capt. Ole Knutsen, was the heaviest gross hauler of halibut at Prince Rupert during the 1932 season, bringing in a total of 220,000 pounds in six trips. The Seattle boat Tatoosh, Capt. K. Martinsen, was second with 207,000 pounds in eight trips and the Ketchikan boat Radio, Capt. W. E. Taagensen, third with 199,000 pounds in five trips.

The Reliance, Capt. Carl Blendheim of Ketchikan landed the most trips at Prince Rupert for the American fleet during the season, coming in twelve times for a total poundage of 129,900 pounds. The Oceanic and Onah each made 11 trips for totals of 156,000 and 149,000 pounds respectively.

The Seattle schooner Eclipse, Capt. A. M. Samuelson, had the heaviest average poundage per trip for the American fleet, her average being 44,666 pounds per trip. The Celtic, Capt. O. J. Edwards, Ketchikan, and Paragon, owned by Noland and Jacobsen, Seattle, each had averages of 42,000 pounds per trip.

Salmon pack statistics as compiled by the supervisor of fisheries for British Columbia showed that the 1932 pack for the coast up to October 29 was 1,040,977 cases as compared with 664,353 cases last year at the corresponding date.
