## Final Honors to Former Premier Andrew Bonar Law in Westminster Abbey Attended by Large Crowds

LONDON, Nov. 5 .- The ashes of Andrew Bonar Law, the OFFICIALS WERE MET man who was for seven months prime minister of Britain, were entombed in Westminster Abbey today.
