## British Unionists Back Premier Baldwin in Fight for Protection; Three Famous Men on his Platform

LONDON, Nov. 21.-Earl Birkenhead made his promised speech in favor of Premier Baldwin's policy of protection and his appearance on the platform with his former opponents as well as that of Austen Chamberlain and Sir Robert Horne, who with Lord Birkenhead deserted Baldwin a year ago for Lloyd George, made a great impression.

Lord Robert Cecil made his farewell speech to his constituents at Hitchin before retiring to the House of Lords. He said although he was a free trader he believed the special circumstances called for full endorsement of the Baldwin program.
