### TYPICAL RUSSIAN BEHAVIOUR

OTHING SHORT of a miracle, it now seems evident, will induce Russia to co-operate with United States, Britain and France in bringing economic aid to Europe. Russia's suspicions, her unwillingness to follow any course that does not fit in with her own aggrandizement, remain. At every hand and on every occasion this becomes evident. Ironically enough, the country which has made countries like Latvia and Esthonia her satellites, which dominates Poland, Rumania, Yugo-Slavia, Hungary, Bulgaria, which seeks to interfere with Turkey and Iran, which threatens Greece, which makes the Scandinavian countries live in deadly fear, talks about United States, Great Britain and France endeavouring to "impose the will of great powers on small European countries by force.'

The outcome of it all? No one wants, if it can be helped, a "bloc" against Russia; that way, in the end, must be disaster. But with Europe the victim of starvation and economic collapse, the United States, Britain and France can harly remain spectators of catastrophe merely because Russia refuses to help-or wants to hinder. Along that path, too, might be calamity.
