## ALBERTA PAPER ON ELECTIONS

**Regrets Defeat of Oliver but sees  
Hope of Government  
Carrying On.**

Discussing the British Columbia political situation, the Edmonton Bulletin says:

British Columbia is in for a period of minority government. While the returns from the general elections are not complete, it is clear that the Oliver ministry cannot hold a majority of the seats in the new Legislature against a combination of opposing groups. There is no suggestion that the ministers will resign, and the prospect is that they will carry on, along such lines as their antagonists may permit. If the government has to seek support outside its own party, the opposition members are split into three factions. That they could unite to form a ministry is doubtful, should the present one be upset. In that, perhaps, lies the hope that the province may avoid a repetition of its political history in the years previous to the accession of Mr. McBride with a dominant majority in the Legislature. In those days the people of British Columbia hardly knew at sundown who would be premier the following morning. It was largely due to popular disgust with political uncertainty and with the kaleidoscopic changes in law and administration which resulted, that Mr. McBride obtained an overwhelming majority in the Legislature and was able to retain almost unlimited power. Whether it is to be chaos or compromise depends upon which the opposition groups choose to make it.

#### Turned Down Beer

There will be interest in this province, too, in noting that the voters turned down a proposal to permit beer to be sold by the glass in licensed places. British Columbia was the first of the "dry" provinces to return to the legalized sale of liquor. But its ill after it has passed through the Atlantic seaboard.

The Red Cedar Shingle-Roof Excels All Other in Desirable Qualities

The manufacture of red cedar shingles is a branch of the Forest Industries of British Columbia of outstanding importance. There are 95 shingle mills in this province and in 1923 these plants manufactured 2,500,000,000 shingles to approximate value of \$10,000,000.

If laid end to end this yearly cut of shingles would reach over 770,000 miles, or more than 30 times around the earth!

Approximately 1,000 feet of lumber is required to make 8,000 shingles.

B.C.'s annual shingle cut would also provide roofs for 125,000 modern residences.

Red cedar grows to the best advantage in British Columbia, which possesses 60 per cent of the world's supply of this wonderful timber. In 1923 the red cedar cut was 573,000,000 ft. Considerably more than half of this amount was used in the manufacture of shingles.

The B.C. shingle industry has an annual payroll of \$3,000,000 and employs about 2,600 men, irrespective of those engaged in logging the red cedar for shingle manufacture.



### FOREST AND FIELD CLUB COMING HERE

Are at Ottawa Today and Will Then Come West and Visit Stewart

Montreal, July 3.—Ottawa is being invaded today by eighty members of the Forest and Field Club of Boston who are making the capital their first stopping point on a trip which will take them over the Canadian National Railways across Canada to Prince Rupert and Vancouver. In addition to Ottawa, Jasper Park and Prince Rupert, they will also make the scenic sea voyage from Prince Rupert as far north as Stewart and down the British Columbia coast to Vancouver. They will spend two days at Jasper Park and while there will engage in a number of hiking trips along the mountain trails.

The party will return home through the United States. G. K. Howard, general tourist agent of the Canadian National Railways, will accompany the party as far as Winnipeg and from there they will be accompanied by an officer of the western region.
