Hon. Ernest Lapointe signed on behalf of Canada while the agreement was signed for the United States by Secretary of State Hughes,

This is the second treaty which has been signed by a Canadian representative without the intervention of Great Britain, Hon. Ernest Lapointe being the representative which signed the Halibut Fisheries Treaty. The event caused a good deal of discussion at that time.
