## PREVENT FUTURE WARFARE IS OBJECTIVE

### EXPERIMENT WITH WIRELESS COMMUNICATION FOR YUKON UNSATISFACTORY

#### Proposal to Germany with View to an Endless Era of Peace Made by France and the Other Allies

LONDON, Aug. 27.—France and her allies have invited Germany to enter into negotiations for a definite treaty intended to guarantee an endless era of peace in western Europe. The invitation was extended in a note handed the German government by the French ambassador at Berlin Monday and made public in the various capitals last night. It is in reply to Germany's note of July 20 on the subject covering three points: That the treaty of Versailles must not be modified. That Germany should enter the League of Nations, not with reservations as Germany suggested. That provision should be made for compulsory arbitration of future disputes between nations.

#### MORE CRIME IN LARGER CITIES

Must be Awakening of Parents, Preachers and Teachers to Prevent it

WINNIPEG, Aug. 27.—The report of the committee on the administration of criminal justice presented to the Bar Association at its convention here, recognizes that crime in the large centres is increasing and special effort is needed to prevent it. There has to be a great awakening of parents, preachers and teachers to prevent children drifting into crime.

#### RUM RUNNING BOATS TAKEN

Two Seized at Discovery Island and Others Escape When Government Launch Arrives

VICTORIA, Aug. 27.—Three boats were arrested and two speed boats seized yesterday when the customs launch Winamac discovered the boats in a cove at Discovery Island. One of the craft seized had 150 cases of whiskey aboard. Two other vessels escaped. A fifth had a satisfactory explanation of their presence at the scene.

#### CHICAGO WOMAN KILLS HUSBAND

Three Deadly Shots is Reply of Mrs. Joseph Carroll to Her Mate's Dare

CHICAGO, Aug. 27.—"You haven't the nerve to shoot," Joseph Carroll said to his wife when she pointed a pistol at him during a family row. Police found the woman, holding her 11 month old baby, sitting beside the body of her dead husband. She had fired three times.

#### CHINESE CREW OF VESSEL GO TO JAIL FOR GOING ON STRIKE

VANCOUVER, Aug. 27.—Sixteen Chinese members of the crew of the freighter City of Victoria, who last week went on strike in obedience, they said, to orders from Shanghai, were yesterday sentenced to serve six weeks in jail, after which they will be deported.

#### ALEX GALLAGHER IS SENT UP FOR TRIAL

Committed by Stewart Magistrate Will Await Return of County Court Judge for Election

Alex Gallagher, committed for trial on Tuesday by Stipendiary Magistrate J. P. Searlett on a charge of having brought stolen goods, namely a gas boat, from United States to Canada, returned to the city on the Prince Charles last evening in custody of Provincial Constable Markland. Gallagher will come up for election in the County Court next week on the return of Judge Young from the interior.

#### Resumption of Service Over Land Line Looked for by Superintendent

That wireless as the regular means of communication for the Yukon will be discontinued in the near future and that service over the old Yukon telegraph line will be restored is the opinion of J. T. Phelan, superintendent of Yukon Telegraphs, who is a visitor in the city in the course of his annual inspection tour. Considerable dissatisfaction has been expressed, Mr. Phelan says, with the service that has been given this year by wireless as compared with the service formerly given when the land line was in operation. Rates are much higher and, in the summer months, atmospheric conditions prevent the people getting the service that they were used to when the land line was in operation. Last March the service was changed from telegraph to wireless. Now the latter has been given a fair try-out, Mr. Phelan thinks that the results warrant going back to the old system. The stations may well be retained for emergency use but for the steady, regular means of communication Mr. Phelan believes that telegraph will be the best. The land line north of Hazelton into the Yukon, he says, has been kept in shape and mended so that service on it can be resumed at any moment.

#### FRENCH DEBT SETTLEMENT

Agreement Gets General Support Although Some Objection is Voiced Against Moratorium

LONDON, Aug. 27.—Commenting on the provisional settlement of the French debt, Joseph Caillaux, finance minister, said: "Each of us must put a little water in our wine." The agreement receives the general support of the British although, in some quarters, criticism is made on the ground that Great Britain is getting "too much water." Objection is taken to the proposed moratorium for France until 1930.

#### Prince Rupert is Destined to Become Thriving Grain Port; Difficulties to be Overcome

"I really believe that in years to come Prince Rupert will be a thriving grain port," writes a grain dealer from the prairies, who knows the business well and who is not biased in favor of this place in any way. He says that grain is like water, it will seek the point of least resistance. One great boost to the grain business here, the letter suggests, would be the building of the railway line from Peace River either by Spirit River or Grande Prairie to Prince George, thus shortening the rail haul to posed cutoff by Brule would not affect this port so favorably, equalizing of the grain rates to both ports would place our facilities on a favorable footing. The letter says that so far as ships are concerned they go where the business is offering and if the business is offering here, there will be no difficulty in that respect. The fact that the steaming time on the round trip is four days in favor of this port over any other in the Oriental trade should make a difference in rates of about 25c a short ton. The handicap of the Canadian National in having to use Great Northern Railway tracks for entry into the city of Vancouver also gives Rupert the edge insofar as the railway is concerned. It is further suggested that canned salmon packed in this portion of the province would be shipped from this port direct if vessels were calling regularly. Turning to the adverse side, it is pointed out that being little farming, ranching and poultry raising in this district would make it difficult to dispose of grain which was off grade as there would be no chance of disposing of it. It would put the port at a disadvantage as only specified grades could be handled here. At Vancouver the off-grade wheat is disposed of all the time locally for the dairies and chicken ranches, thus reducing the amount of grain the exporter has to carry in store. Whether the time is ripe for the advent of an exporting house the writer is doubtful. So much, he thinks, depends upon the development of the Peace River country. The letter will be useful in that it points out difficulties which have to be overcome in shipping grain through the elevator here and also mentions the advantages.

#### MORE FLAMES IN MONTREAL

Property Loss of \$300,000 Was Caused by Fires Which Menaced City Last Night

MONTREAL, Aug. 27.—Montreal was seriously menaced by fire again last night. Four fires were fought within a period of a few hours. A loss of \$300,000 was caused by the flames.

#### STREET CAR CUTS OFF BOTH LEGS OF 5-YEAR OLD GIRL

Did Not Cry or Lose Consciousness But Died in Hospital After Father Had Given Quart of Blood

MONTREAL, Aug. 27.—With both legs amputated by the wheels of a street car, Helen Synette, aged five, was carried to the police station by the motorman. The child did not cry or lose consciousness but died in the hospital after her father had given a quart of his blood in an attempt to save her life.

#### LOS ANGELES WIFE MURDERER SUICIDES

Dr. Thomas W. Young, Dentist, Strangles Himself in Jail

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 27.—Dr. Thomas W. Young, dentist, charged with murdering his wife and disposing of the body in a cistern, today committed suicide in jail by strangling himself with a piece of wire.

#### MADE RECORD IN POURING CEMENT ELEVATOR BINS

Carter-Halls - Aldinger Co. Ltd. had the best day yet on Wednesday in the pouring of concrete for the elevator storage bins. The record was 9 feet one inch in the two shifts. This brings the height of the structure now to 81 feet six inches not including the basement. It is likely that, by the end of the week, the total height of 95 feet of bins proper will be reached. Then the top floor and cupolas will be put on.

#### TWO DROWNED FROM LAUNCH

Tale of Murder and Suicide is Being Investigated by Searchers

PETERSBURGH, Alaska, Aug. 27.—Investigators of the tale that Thomas Rise killed his wife by pushing her overboard from a gasoline launch and committed suicide by jumping in after her are hunting for his body. Her's was found yesterday.

#### Flying Officer Hull and His Mechanic, Corporal Davenport, had Close Call in Plane Smash

Flying Officer A. H. Hull and Corporal H. E. Davenport were fortunate to escape with their lives at the end of last week when plane G.M. was wrecked in the rough waters of Milbank Sound when a connecting rod in their engine was broken and the motor flew to pieces. After the forced landing had been made, the officers of the machine, who were accompanied by Fisheries Overseer D. S. Cameron, floated around for three-quarters of an hour until the American steamer Yukon, Capt. Glascock, hove in sight. By this time the machine was just about on the rocks but Capt. Glascock nosed his vessel between the rocks and took the ship in tow. With everybody still on board, the flying boat was towed by the Yukon to the north end of Milbank Sound where it was picked up by the Malaspina. Mr. Cameron then went aboard the patrol ship while Flying Officer Hull and Corporal Davenport remained with the plane. On the way to China Hat, the plane capsized nose first and Flying Officer Hull and Corporal Davenport were both thrown into the sea. They clambered out, however, and were taken aboard the steamer. The wrecked plane is now at China Hat and is being taken down preparatory to being shipped on the lighthouse tender Estevan either here or to Vancouver. In any case, this will be the last of plane GM as far as her activities this year are concerned. The hull and wings of the plane, despite the experience, are reported to be in good shape. This is the second plane that has been put out of business in fisheries patrol in this district this season. Plane DU, piloted by Flying Officer Morfee, in making a forced landing in Queen Charlotte Sound a few weeks ago, had the hull so badly smashed that it was burned at Hardy Bay. The wings were, however, intact and were sent to Vancouver while the engine is now in plane GN which is being flown here by Squadron Leader Tudhope.

#### Dunwell Capital to be Doubled in Order to Place Bear River Mine on a Producing Basis

VICTORIA, Aug. 27.—Operation of the Dunwell Mine on Bear River near Stewart is to be carried on by the present company and in order to do this the capital of the mine is to be increased from \$350,000 to \$700,000, it was decided at a general meeting of shareholders of the company held here yesterday. The expenditure of this money will put the property in such a position as to be second only to the Premier in importance in the Portland canal camp. The mine will then be on a producing basis. Shareholders of the company are given the first option of taking the new issue of par and subscriptions amounting to \$140,000 have already been received. As the present shares of the company are held at around \$1.60 to \$2.00 a share, the allotting of the shares to present holders is in the nature of a bonus to them.

#### URGES JUSTICE RICH AND POOR

Lord Buckmaster Suggests to Barristers that they Take Poor Men's Cases

WINNIPEG, Aug. 27.—Declaring that justice should be swift, certain and open alike to rich and poor, Lord Buckmaster of Cheddington, former Lord Chancellor of England, told the annual convention of the Canadian Bar Association last night that in his opinion the legal profession deserved reproach, in that while the poor man was sure of even justice from the bench he was not sure to get it from the bar. He advanced the idea to remedy this reproach when he suggested that every lawyer take a certain number of poor men's cases every year.

#### NEW YORK TONG WAR IS ENDED

Five Orientals Killed, Several Wounded and Large Number are Under Arrest

**Knockers Club At Same Old Game.**

When we were all trying to get an elevator, the grouchers stood back and said we would never succeed. Now that it is being built they stand back and say it will never be used. When wheat is pouring through it and we are all busy as bees, the same little band of knockers will stand back and spit and tell us we shall die young if we work so hard.

**Take Easy Money From Local Lambs.**

During the past few weeks the city has been flooded with stock sellers offering shares in all sorts of companies, mostly in the east or south. They come in here without anything to show that their propositions are really genuine and they hand out the usual line of talk by means of which they get away with the money. Based on experiences of the past, those who have put up their hard earned cash can wish it goodby and get down to work again and earn another stake. The probability is their money is gone to bolster up some concern that will never pay dividends and the stock will gradually dwindle in value until it disappears from the stock lists altogether. Such is past history and such is likely to be the history of the future.

We have stated before and we state it again that stock which has to be peddled around the country is usually of little value. It seldom pays dividends. There have been exceptions but not one occurs to us just now. Yet we remember dozens that have proved valueless.

**Loaded Against The Investor.**

Stock that is sold through travelling salesmen is purely speculative and cannot be considered an investment. It is loaded worse than a horse race. To begin with, the cost of selling the stock runs anywhere from twenty to forty per cent whereas at the races only ten per cent is deducted by the operators. No legitimate business can stand such a handicap at the start.

Those who are in business today know that if they pay five per cent on their investment they are doing well. That is when the whole of the capital actually goes into the business. If only sixty or seventy per cent actually reaches the treasury the condition is worse.

People who know nothing of business imagine that great profits are made and that all they have to do is to get on the "inside." Unfortunately such is not the case. Profits on any legitimate business are small and if twenty or thirty per cent of the investment is taken at the start, the remainder cannot expect to pay any dividends. Remember there is only one Henry Ford in the world. He is a genius.

**Freezing Out To Be Contended With.**

In addition to the ordinary mortality of business, the small stockholder has to contend with the big investors that control the big plants and freeze out the others. There are a number of plants in Canada and even in British Columbia not a thousand miles from home that have never paid a cent of dividend to stockholders and yet seem to be prosperous. Sometimes the output is sold to a subsidiary or parent company at a price that allows no profit and the other concern takes the rakeoff. Sometimes by the time the bondholders are paid there is nothing left for the stockholder.

When a stock seller goes around the country offering shares, does he tell how many bonds are also issued by the company? Does he show the balance sheet? Does he tell how much is paid for promotion? He does not. He talks otherwise sensible men and women into buying paper certificates that have about as much value as wall paper, not a cent more, so far as likely returns are concerned.

**Sporting Chance In Gold Mine Promotion.**

In a gold mine promotion the shareholder does have a sporting chance, because if the mine is proved rich it overcomes even the handicap of expensive flotation. Many people have made money by speculating in that way. Putting money into a mine is not investing. It is speculating. It is taking a chance. But there is a chance, whereas the industrial concern that asks for your money and pays a big promotion commission probably never will and never can pay any dividend and your cash is gone just as if you had thrown it into the sea.

**Put Your Money Into Something Sound.**

If you have some money to invest and you are not satisfied with the bank rate of interest, buy something worth while. Prince Rupert city bonds pay a good rate of interest and you are sure of the return. Victory bonds of course are the best but they do not pay very high rates. Still it is better to get a small rate of interest and know the principal is safe than to listen to rosy promises of salesmen and lose everything. The stock they offer cannot be sold again if the money is needed, whereas any sound stocks can be sold on the open market at any time.

**B.C. Silver and Other Mines of Promise in Salmon River Valley Described in Report**

(By G. A. Clothier, Resident Engineer)  
The B.C. Silver Mines Ltd., organized in 1919, with a capitalization of \$1,500,000, divided into 1,500,000 shares, owns a group of eleven mineral claims north of and adjoining the holdings of the Premier Gold Mining Company. During the last three years the company has done over a mile of underground work and several thousand feet of diamond-drilling. Two tunnels have been driven. The lower one was started on the Oakville Fraction and driven 1,050 feet to intersect a continuation of the Premier ore-zone to the north. About 1,000 feet of drifting was then done on this zone without satisfactory results. Last year an upper tunnel, 270 feet vertically higher than the No. 1, was driven 720 feet, from which two crosscuts were run south and one to the north.

Last year the work was confined to the upper tunnel, which has been extended 1,425 feet, making the total drivage of nearly 2,200 feet; 5,400 feet of diamond drilling was also done this year from this level. Two holes show very favorable indications of commercial ore and a third hole will be bored for further information.

The property is well equipped with camps, assay office, power plant, etc.

It was announced by Manager C. A. Banks (in February, 1925) that the diamond drill on No. 3 level has just intersected a very important ore-body. The drill passed through 58 feet of ore, which, allowing for the dip of the vein, indicates an ore-body of 45 feet in width. Ten feet of the drill-core averaged \$22.80, 13 feet averaged \$30, and 9 feet averaged \$40 to the ton. The whole ore-body is of commercial grade. Further drilling is being pushed ahead to determine the extent of this ore-body.

C. A. Banks is manager and C. B. North in charge of the work at the mine.

**Silver Crest**

The Silver Crest Mines, Ltd., was incorporated in October, 1919, with a capitalization of \$500,000, divided into 2,000,000 shares, and took over the Silver Hill group of eleven Crown-granted mineral claims. They are situated on the south-east side of Mount Dilworth at the head of the Salmon River valley. In 1920 some twenty-four open cuts were put in under the supervision of P. W. Racey, M.E. No work has been done on the claims since then until last year, when several open cuts were made and two tunnels driven, with Seymour Campbell, the original staker of some of the claims in 1919, in charge of the work.

The country rock is mainly slates overlying volcanic tuffs and quartz porphyries. The slates have been laid down since the mineralization of the underlying formation, as there is no fracturing or mineralization in the slates. In places the slates have been eroded, exposing the mineralized "greenstones" underlying them.

The work last year was done on the September Fraction claim, on which, in fact, practically all the work to date has been done. Seven open cuts were put in west of the middle bunch of open cuts referred to in the old work to trace the mineralization through. At No. 3 of these cuts a tunnel was started to cut the ore exposed above in cuts 1 and 2. This (No. 1) tunnel was driven a distance of 107 feet. Near the portal a vein of good ore was crossed which does not crop on the surface. About 30 feet back from the face of the tunnel a crosscut was driven west, cutting 40 feet of vein without reaching the hanging wall. The last 3 feet is reported to be very good ore.

No. 2 tunnel was started 300 feet horizontally and 125 feet vertically below No. 1; the first 15 feet is open cut and from there to the face is 44 feet, but a further 30 or 40 feet will be required to get under the ore exposure in cut No. 7 above. So far only small stringers of ore have been found.

Some very high silver assays were obtained from the surface cuts and altogether the results of the year's work have been very satisfactory and encouraging to the company.

**Northland Co.**

The Northland Mining Co., Ltd., was incorporated early in January, 1925, with a capitalization of \$1,500,000, divided into 1,500,000 shares, to take over the Troy group of mineral claims,

situated at the head of the Salmon River Valley, about a mile south of Summit lake. The group consists of nine mineral claims—Troy, Troy No. 2, Troy No. 3, Butte, Welcome, Deadwood, L.X., Edward, and Terry—owned by Neil McDonald and C. H. Lake, of Stewart, who bonded them this fall to E. O. Weston, of Victoria. The country rock in that vicinity is the Bear River formation, or locally called greenstones, overlain in places by the un-eroded slates that predominate on the east of Mount Dilworth.

Considerable work has been done by Neil McDonald in tracing the veins by stripping and open cutting, and I am reliably informed that some very fine showings have thus been exposed. On the Troy No. 3 claim an open cut shows the mineralization to be 15 feet in width, of which 5 feet in width is said to assay 255.6 oz. silver to the ton and 5.6 per cent lead. Another cut on the same vein gave assays of 35.6 oz. silver to the ton and 43.5 per cent lead across 2 1/2 feet. On the Troy No. 2 claim a cut 6 feet deep shows a width of 6 feet of ore assaying 10.7 oz. silver to the ton and 34.2 per cent lead. All this indicates that the property merits development.

# NOT MUCH GOLD IS TAKEN OUT FROM GOLD PAN

Dave Mawhinney Says it Will Just About Pay for the Grub This Year

## WENT IN BY DOG TEAM

Found Body of Prospector in Delapidated Cabin Where he Died Last Winter

"The country is full of gold but the work at Gold Pan and surrounding creeks has not been up to expectations and the operators there will not get much more than enough to pay for their grub this year, according to D. C. Mawhinney of Copper City, who is in the city today on his way home.

Mr. Mawhinney says there are forty men working on Gold Pan Creek, a dozen of whom are operating the claims where the first discovery was made by Dan Grady. At the time he left only \$200 worth of gold had reached Telegraph Creek Gold Commissioner's office from the diggings but it was known that 160 ounces had been taken out by Grady and associates. This was not a bad showing for the first year. At the same time it would only just about pay for the grub, for everything there is very expensive, the cost of transportation being so high.

## Died of Sickness

Mr. Mawhinney was the man who discovered the body of Kinder, the prospector, who had gone to look for the lost mine. Leaving Hazelton by dog team last March he passed from the head of the Skeena River to the south head of the Stikine. He found Kinder in an old delapidated cabin with plenty of food supplies around him. Apparently he had been taken ill and was unable to help himself. There were no windows in the cabin and no firewood cut. Long logs of wood had been put into the stove, leaving one end out, showing that he had been unable to chop wood and had prepared no store in

advance. The place was miserable and uncared for. Mawhinney was there on April 20. The body of the prospector was frozen and he considered it likely he had died about February. He left the body in the cabin and it was later buried by Cline Dexter who had taken forty head of horses into the country.

## Plane Coming Soon

Asked as to the big plane which had gone in there early this season from Prince Rupert, Mr. Mawhinney said it had made several trips into the Liard country but so far as he knew had not obtained any results worth mentioning. They were expecting to leave soon and would fly to Prince Rupert. Operation of the plane is costly as gasoline there costs a dollar a gallon.

Mr. Mawhinney says there are seven tractors plying from Telegraph Creek to Dease Lake, a distance of 72 miles, taking in supplies and machinery and doing general freighting.

There is a possibility that Mr. Mawhinney may go in again next year, he says.

# EARL McLEOD AT SKIDEGATE

Reached There at One O'clock Today in Hour and Three Quarters

Leaving Digby Island base at 11:15 this morning, flying boat EA, piloted by Flight Lieutenant Earl McLeod, covered the 150 mile distance to Skidegate, Queen Charlotte Islands, in one hour and three-quarters reaching there at 1 o'clock this afternoon. This is considered very good time by Squadron Leader Tudhope who, in plane GN, accompanied Lieut. MacLeod about 20 miles out. While there were low clouds hanging here, it was clear outside and visibility was excellent.

On board Lieut. MacLeod's plane was Major E. J. Ashton, commissioner of the Soldiers' Settlement Board from Ottawa, who is to look over land on Graham Island particularly around Massett Inlet and on the East coast. He will be taken on flights tomorrow and the day after and then Lieut. MacLeod will be engaged in patrol work until the plane is brought back here next Wednesday or Thursday. Lieut. K. G. McCullagh of the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals also made the flight to the Islands. A mechanic is already there, having gone across by goal.

### INVESTORS WARNED

The Editor, Daily News.  
May I take the liberty through your columns to voice a word of warning against the operations of stock salesmen who are endeavoring to convince the public of the fortunes to be made by investing their money in enterprises which are more or less unknown in the financial world? The arguments chiefly used by these salesmen consist of a glowing account of the prospects before their respective companies, accompanied by verbal examples of the fortunes which have been made by others who were supposedly lucky enough to get in on the ground floor.

It should be remembered by those who seek safe investment with reasonable dividend yields that the production of articles of merchandise and the production of dividends are by no means synonymous terms and one of the first rules which a prospective investor would do well to observe would be to investigate carefully the past record of those promoting these enterprises, the history of their dividend payments and above all to analyse their present financial position; and what security an investor would have for placing his money in the hands of those to whom he must submit control over operations. Considerable sums of local money have of late been invested in wildcat schemes through the enterprise of high powered stock salesmen and I feel sure that if such investors had insisted upon the light of day being allowed to filter through the financial affairs of some of these concerns they would not in future years have to count as a sad experience their venture into a speculative fortune.
