Ten people killed and 33 missing as result of MAKING TRIP terrible explosions at Lake Denmark in New Jersey late Saturday

DOVER, New Jersey, July 12 .- Fire and barrages of exploding shells today continued to prevent the ascertaining of the omplete toil of death and havoc caused by fire and explosions in the navy's largest amminition depot located at Lake Denmark. 85 miles west of Jersey City, which was struck by lightning ate Saturday. Te npersons are reported dead, 35 are missing and the damage is estimated at \$100,000,000.

For a radius of 30 miles houses were shaken and automobiles were overturned on the highways.
