Granby Consolidated has reduced its outstanding first mortgage bonds since the first of the year by \$200,000, also there has recently been exchanged for stock some of the 7 per cent convertibles, althoug the company is paying no dividends at present, says Northwest Mining Service of Spokane. It is also reported on the authority of one of the directors of the company that when dividend resumption comes, it will be at the rate of not less than \$3 a share annually, which is \$1 a share higher than had been previously expected. N. L. Amster of Boston has been elected a director of the Granby Company. following rumors that he and astociates had purchased a consideratble block of Granby stock.

The improvement in Granby's physical, financial and earning position, which has come about as the result of the construction and rehabilitation campaign, raises the question as to how soon the company will resume dividends. The correct answer to this question must assume certain developments with regard to retiring the Londed debt. **OUTSTANDING BOND ISSUES** Ahead of Granby stock at the end of 1925 were \$1.353.400 first mortgage convertible 6s (on which the conversion privilege has expired), and \$2,250,000 per cent convertible debentures, convertible any time before May 1, 1930. at \$25 a share. The first 6s come due in May 1928. It is highly desirable that this latter issue be exchanged for stock as, even if the full amount is so converted, the outstanding stock of Granby will amount to only about 444,303 shares, and a saving of \$175,000 annual interest charges will be made. Because of the white spread between the call price and the selling price of the stock or bonds, the company would require only a very small amount of
