Four Drowned and Two Saved When Schooner Noble Crashed on Rock

VICTORIA, January 7 .--- Four people were drowned when the motor schooner Noble of Vancouver was wrecked on Escalante Reef on the west coast of Vancouver Island, according to word received here. The drowned are Captain J. Kerr, Chief Engineer H. Williams, Chief Officer B. Wall, Cook S. V. Herby. Wireless Officer Cliff Deschamps and Second Engineer F. Bell were taken off by the Tofino lifeboat.

In Prince Rupert there are people from many nations. We have a large Scandinavian population, some Greeks, Belgians, French, wonder that north of that line finds Dutch, Italians, Syrians, Armenians, Russians, German, Japanese and Chinese, and this does not exhaust the list. All have to do business in English and not to be able to do it causes hardship to the foreign resident and annoyance to the Canadian.

Efforts are made to teach English to some of these, but it is a matter for the new arrival to take up. Sometimes a man will be able to speak English but his wife speaks the home language. That means that the husband never really learns English well because he speaks the other at home. To learn a language it is necessary to speak it a good deal of the time, preferably all the time.

We suggest, then, to newcomers who do not speak English or who speak it only indifferently, that they speak it in their homes and teach their children to do the same. A great many do this already but others do not.

SICKNESS AND MENTALITY

BLOOD TESTS AS EVIDENCE Woman Convicted of Imprisonment for Perjury in German Case LONDON, Jan. 7 .- The use of blood tests to determine paternity is illustrated by two legal cases reported from Germany during the past week. The first was heard in Wurtemberg, where a woman applying for an affiliation order swore that a certain man was the father of her illegitimate child. The defence countered by producing evidence that the characteristics of the infant's blood were incompatible with this relationship. The blood of the man, they said, was of one type, and the woman's was of another; it was impossible that the union of two such persons could have produced offspring whose blood had the characteristics demonstrated.
