#### Side and Prince Struck on Point of Shoulder

VANCOUVER, June 5.—Prince Henry, visiting here en route to England from Japan, suffered a fracture of the collar bone when his pony slipped and fell with him at Brighouse Park yesterday afternoon during a game of polo. He was brought to the city and given medical attention.

The prince made light of the accident and assured everyone around that the injury was slight. It happened in the eighth chukker when the prince's team was three points up in the score. Swinging in on the ball the pony slipped and fell flat on its side. The prince was thrown on the point of his shoulder and the bone snapped.

All plans for the royal visit here were set aside and the plan to leave for Alberta Friday may have to be changed.

Col. J. P. Fell, one of the players on the opposition team, who was near when the accident happened, said the prince had been giving an excellent display of horsemanship and proved himself an able polo player. He was injured through no fault of his own.

Physicians attending the Duke of Gloucester issued the following statement today: "His Royal Highness was uncomfortable during the night, but is resting more comfortably now. The worst of his distress is over and his condition is good. The fracture is in perfect position." The bulletin was signed by Dr. W. H. Sutherland, Dr. Frank P. Patterson and Dr W. L. Graham.

#### PEACE RIVER WESTERN ROUTE

It is pretty sure that next year at the latest there will be a definite announcement in regard to the building of a western route from the Peace River. Also, there will be a good deal of branch line building in that territory. While it is much too early to make any definite prophecy, it is difficult to conceive of any policy which will fail to beneft Prince Rupert. Should the C. P. R. and C. N. R. decide on a joint policy with running rights for both lines to the coast at Prince Rupert and Vancouver, as is generally expected, the northern port will benefit. Many think the coming of the C.P.R. to the city would be the beginning of a new era of development, and perhaps it would.

There have been innumerable delays in regard to this western outlet, but the Dominion has had all the railway building it could handle in the Hudson Bay line, which was promised to the prairie people at least thirty years ago. It will be completed this year and possibly they will not know what to do with it. In the Peace River is a large population all ready to do business. They are every year speaking with greater force when they ask for that western outlet and it must come soon. When announcement is made, it may be expected that a definite scheme will have been adopted which will serve both Vancouver and Prince Rupert and be of benefit to both. Unless some unexpected setback occurs, something is sure to be announced definitely within a year, perhaps earlier than we think:
