# TIMBER SALE X 5081.

Sealed Tenders will be received by the Minister of Lands, at Victoria, not later than noon on the 22nd day of June, 1923, for the purchase of Licence X 5081, to cut 5,101,000 feet of Spruce and Hemlock, and 1,200,000 feet of felled and bucked spruce and hemlock, on an area situated on Limestone Bay, Louise Island, Queen Charlotte Islands Land District.

Two (2) years will be allowed for removal of timber.

# BOARD OF TRADE ENDORSES BURNS LAKE TRUNK ROAD

At the meeting of the Board of Trade last night it was decided to endorse a request from the Burns Lake Citizen's Association asking the provincial government to complete the Burns Lake-Endako highway. There was some opposition to the resolution, it being pointed out that other roads of more benefit to farmers were required more and that road did not serve many people. The objection was overruled and the resolution of endorsement passed by a good majority.

# ASKS GOVERNMENT TO BUILD TERRACE BRIDGE

At the meeting of the Board of Trade last night a resolution asking the Provincial Government to earmark part of the sum set aside for bridges to be applied to the bridge at Terrace was passed.  
It was pointed out that there was already an appropriation for that purpose and it was understood the abutments would be put in next fall.  
The Provincial Government will be written in regard to the city's support of the work.
