## The Wheat Argument

A FEDERAL TREASURY grant of \$65,000,000 to western wheat growers has provided the major political storm of the current parliamentary session—a storm that may erupt again and again.

It was voted on the day Parliament adjourned for the Easter holiday—March 21—after an unprecedented Senate attempt to kill it was beaten back in that chamber.

The debate in both chambers added more than 200,000 words to Hansard records, brought demands that Agriculture Minister Gardiner should resign, and claims that he had implied a breach of faith by the United Kingdom government.

The grant makes possible an 8.3-cents-a-bushel final payment to the growers for wheat they delivered into a five-year wheat pool which the government set up in 1946 to fulfil the four-year Anglo-Canadian wheat agreement. This agreement began operating with the 1946-47 crop year.

Opponents of the vote claimed the wheat growers were getting preferential treatment at the expense of all the taxpayers. Critics of the vote, mainly representing wheat areas, claimed it was not nearly enough.

Government supporters retorted that if all the various forms of aid to Canadian primary industries were taken into consideration this final settlement would not be out of proportion, that it was fair from both angles.

The four-year agreement with the United Kingdom, with the government's five-year pooling plan for stabilizing wheat export prices through operations of the Canadian Wheat Board, made up such a complicated situation that it was difficult to weigh and balance the various charges and counter-charges at Ottawa, let alone here at Prince Rupert where our interest in agricultural problems—wheat at least—is indirect.

The net result is that—with the 8.3-cent payment—the growers will finally have received approximately \$1.83 for each of the 1,435,955,510 bushels of wheat delivered and sold during the pooling period.

During that period there were times when the world price was much higher. Had the situation been reversed, however, and the bottom had fallen out of the world wheat market, the Canadian grower would have been protected by a guaranteed floor price.

Though actually set up in 1946 the pool was made retroactive to the summer of 1945. This was because 1945-46 production was needed to fill British requirements in the first year of the contract—1946-47. The pool, and the contract, both expired July 31 last year.

### MEETS SHEIKH SAHIB

JAMMU, Kashmir. — As you fly north over the Punjab you think "how much like Western Canada it is."

That impression deepens when you land at Amritsar. For, while the mid-morning March temperature is more like a May day in Alberta, the land looks much the same. But I cannot stop just yet, at Amritsar, for I am on my way to Kashmir to keep a date with the Prime Minister—Sheikh Mohammed Abdullah.

We land at Jammu, the winter capital of Kashmir, and a tall, grave-faced, slim, blue-turbaned officer drives me to the government guest house.

There is one other guest—a young American lady tourist, determined to get to Srinagar. But the planes have been held up for several days by the heavy snow. I almost have to pinch myself, in the cool air here, to remember that only a week ago I was literally boiling in Bombay.

YOU NEED TWO Blankets to sleep here in Jammu, but the sun is warm, even in the early morning.

Sharp at 10 I am ushered in to see "Sheikh Sahib," as everybody calls him here. The Prime Minister's official home, looks out over the Tawi River, and the ripple of the rushing water, with birds roaring overhead, gives an air of peace and cheerfulness to the place.

I have met the Sheikh briefly two or three times before in Delhi, but we deliberately arranged the interview here. Firstly, I wanted to hear all sides of the Kashmir question before coming here and to study the documents. Secondly, things always look different when you are discussing them on the spot than they do from far away.

THE SHEIKH TOLD ME THAT the plans for Kashmir's Constituent Assembly are going ahead fine. He expects the elections to take place in late June or early July, 1951. There will, he regrets, be no elected representatives from that part of Kashmir which is held by the Pakistan army. (About one-quarter the population.)

The legal power to rule Kashmir and Jammu still rests with the Maharajah. But in all the events of the past few years nobody in Kashmir and Jammu (not even the Maharajah) has contested the principle that "all power derives from the people." Thus, even when the Maharajah "acceded" on a limited basis to India, he did so with the clearly expressed condition that the people themselves should have the final say as to their political destiny.

OUR TALK LASTED 55 MINUTES and we covered a lot of ground. I shall discuss general government and especially Kashmir's land reform program—which is the most advanced in all India—in later articles.

Here I want to sum up what Abdullah, the "Lion of Kashmir," told me about the dispute now before the UN. First, he says, the Pakistan forces must withdraw from the areas their armies seized. Then the refugees, driven out from their homes, must be restored and rehabilitated. Then—and only then—the Kashmir and Jammu government agrees to the actual holding of a UN plebiscite for the entire area. But he and the other cabinet ministers are quite as insistent as anybody in Pakistan that the whole state must go to Pakistan or stay with India.

SHEIKH ABDULLAH SEEMS sincerely confident that the majority of the people of the state would vote to stay with India. But he is emphatic that the whole government of the whole state will loyally accept the verdict. "If they vote to go with Pakistan I will go, too," he said.

As to Pakistan's demand for the withdrawal of all Indian troops from Kashmir, the Prime Minister of Kashmir says: "No—just look at this map." He showed me how Pakistan could rush in troops in two days, whereas it would take India a month to rebuild the comra-

If the UN really wants a plebiscite on Kashmir, they can do no better than to follow the general plan outlined by him, maybe with minor modifications. Otherwise, the sooner they forget the whole business the better. For no plan for a plebiscite could be much, if any, more fair.

Usually when leading from the weak hand toward the strong hand to finesses, you should lead the smallest card of the suit. But unusual situations require unusual plays.

You have to be good when you're playing with Miss Brash. She really puts her partners in some tough contracts. Mr. Champion looked the dummy over in today's deal and wondered where Miss Brash got her two no trump bid. Well, it was too late now to do anything about the bidding and Mr. Champion started concentrating on the play.

It was obvious that he had to bring in a lot of diamond tricks or else go set. If there had been an entry to dummy outside of diamonds, Mr. Champion would have considered playing the ace and king of that suit, hoping the queen would drop. With no side entries, however, that play

would have done him no good as the jack would have blocked the suit on the third round.  
But there was still hope. If Mr. Masters had three diamonds to the queen and Mr. Abel held the doubleton ten, the entire suit could be brought in without loss. Not much of a chance. But when the adverse cards must lie in a certain way for you to make your contract, you may as well play as though they are that way.

Mr. Masters opened the deuce of hearts, Mr. Abel won the ace and returned the eight on which Mr. Champion played the nine. Mr. Masters won with the jack and shifted to the jack of clubs which was won in the closed hand with the queen.  
Now Mr. Champion led a low diamond to dummy's ace in case Mr. Abel held the lone queen. He returned to his hand with the ace of clubs and laid down the jack of diamonds. Mr. Masters covered with the queen and the king was put up in dummy. As you see, this play trapped Mr. Abel's ten, making all of dummy's diamonds good.  
Another long shot winner for Miss Brash. Another ill-earned reward for her slapdash style.  
But she saw nothing out of the ordinary in the bidding or the result. "Just as I thought, partner," she said. "I felt sure it would be a laydown."  
Mr. Champion only groaned.

### Timely RECIPES

**MEAT LOAF**  
2 pounds ground lean beef  
1/4 pound ground suet or salt pork  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1 cup canned or cooked tomatoes (or thin tomato soup or catsup)  
2 cups coarse dry crumbs  
2 tablespoons chopped onion  
1 1/2 teaspoons salt  
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard, if desired  
1/2 cup skim milk  
Pour all ingredients into bowl in order given. Mix well. The mixture will be sticky. Shape into a loaf in a shallow pan. Bake uncovered in 350° F. oven about 1 1/2 hours. Eight servings.

With a crew of 14, the S. D. Brooks' log shows a deep set history—reaching as far away as Jamaica and South America. She was built as a Royal Navy tug "and is meant for this kind of work," said her skipper.

Sometimes hauling rafts of logs as far south as Vancouver, the Brooks usually brings her tows to Captain's Cove across Hecate Straits from Cumshewa Inlet in Ogden Channel where smaller tugs pick them up for the tow to coast mills through the Inside Passage. Due to the rough waters, only one Davis raft is brought across at a time.

"From two to three and one quarter million board feet are in each raft," explained the skipper, who has experienced trouble in northern gales. For this reason weather conditions are checked carefully by Radio Officer D. F. Nicol, and the captain's experienced eye.

The crew is well quartered, with separate messes for officers and men and sleeping cabins.

Her adopted daughter, Elizavita, aged 5, reads the inscription on the cake which says happy birthday in English and Polish. On her anniversary Mrs. Wilsdorf received the most treasured gift she had ever hoped for—the news that she would be resettled in the United States of America, as soon as arrangements can be made.

## Gardening....

TOP QUALITY AT LOW COST  
GROWN IN SMALL GARDEN

In the home vegetable garden and flower borders, fertility need not be a problem. A deep black loam is a joy to work and will grow beautiful plants, but any porous top soil into which an adequate amount of commercial plant food and what humus we can obtain are spaded will do as well, even though it is not black.

Four to six pounds of a balanced plant food mixture to each 100 square feet of garden area will be sufficient in most cases. To give an extra finish to the crop, do not hesitate to use more, applied as maturity approaches. If during the season plants show signs of deficiency, this should be corrected.

Deficiency symptoms include the following: When leaves turn light green or yellow, but do not fall off, nitrogen is lacking. When leaf margins brown, especially the lower leaves, potash is needed. Plants stunted in growth probably need more phosphorus.

It is rarely necessary to get a soil test for a small garden. A complete plant food will take care of deficiencies without giving a harmful overdose of any, if used according to instructions. The point is being stressed that well-fed crops do not reduce the amount of humus in the soil, since more humus is produced by the roots of plants than by their tops. A heavy crop, fed by any sort of plant food, will leave more humus than it found.

The heaviest application of plant food should be made at the beginning of the season, and here commercial plant food has a distinct advantage. It is available to plants at low temperatures and will stimulate growth during the cool weather. Organic plant food has to be broken down by bacteria before the plants can use it, and this

requires a temperature of at least 70 degrees.

To get the most out of plant food, the following methods of application are recommended by researchers:

1. On soils which are acid, plant food should be concentrated in bands or pockets, not touching plant roots but within easy reach.

2. On sweet soils, spade plant food thoroughly into the soil, evenly and deeply.

To apply the first method stretch the line to mark the row in which seeds are to be planted. Then, not less than two inches away on either side, make a furrow four inches deep. Pour plant food into each furrow at the rate of one pound (or pint) for 50 feet, and cover it with earth. Then make the drill in which seeds are to be sown and proceed with planting as usual.

The standard application of a balanced plant food is four pounds per 100 square feet (a space 10 x 10 feet square). You may figure one pound per pint, so an area 10 x 10 feet requires two quarts. One quart will feed 50 square feet and one pint two square feet.

Where smaller quantities are required, use a rounded tablespoon per square foot.
