# OUTLOOK IN PEACE GOOD

Farmers of That District Are Looking Forward to Winter With Optimism

With good weather conditions general throughout British Columbia, east of the mountains. Peace River farmers are looking forward with considerable optimism to the winter. J. Travis, assistant district agriculturist, the one lone representative of the department of agriculture in the district, has forwarded a cheerful report on conditions in the Peace to the department at Vic-

Drying winds and sunshine speeded up threshing operations with the result that practically all grain in stook was threshed. The SEAECH IS some extent and much tough wheat is reported.

Yields of wheat are expected to show a slight increase over last rear with, of course, lower grades In average throughout the district of 35 bushels per acre may be looked for.

Some heavy yields of oats were secured from the Fort St. John district, several farmers reporting throughout the whole area is not expected to exceed 70 bushels, how-

Owing to prevailing low prices for threshed grain much stacking of lack of visibility prevented Royal oats will be done, and generous quantities of feed will be available at low prices. Oat bundles at the present time are worth around two cents. For the same reason cattle and hops are in much demand with a limited supply available.

The supply of potatoes wil doubtless be low on account of adverse growing and harvesting conditions. A large percentage of the crop was still in the ground during the first two weeks of the month. with the result that occasional frosts worked some damage. Yields were low; in many districts only half a crop of low quality. Some improvement in yield and quality was seen on the north side of the Peace
