OTTAWA, May 16:-Canada should send a delegation to Australia and Australia should do the same with Canada, declared Hon. J. T. Fenton, minister of trade and commerce in the Commonwealth government, when addressing the Canadian Club here.

"There are so many things we can do for one another, it is a pity we remain so far apart," Mr. Fenton said. "Let not the distance of the ocean keep us apart."
