Great Britain No Longer Predominant In Empire But **Merely Dominion** 

LONDON, Nov. 115:-Britain is no longer a predominant partner of the Empire of Nations. She is not even the first among the equals. She is merely a Dominion like the rest of the Dominions. This is the opinion of Rt. Hon. J. H. Thomas, Secretary of State for the Dominions, as expressed here last night.

Mr. Thoma's declared that the Imperial Conference, in his view, would mark a tremendous step forward in the progress of co-equal partnership with the Empire.



A. W. Neill Asks For Special Duties So As Not to Harm Island Trade

NANAIMO, Nov. 15:-A shipment of Chinese anthracite coal is due to arrive in Vancouver soon, according to a communication received from A. W. Neill, M.P. for Comox-Alberni. Mr. Neill states that the coal is mined by men and women in the Orient under conditions which make it impossible for Vancouver Island coal to compete with. Mr. Neill has wired Hon. E. B. Ryckman, minister of national revenue, urging that special duties be imposed on the coal upon its arrival in Vancouver.
