General Wolfe spent the earlier part of his life, after his birth, at Westerham, at his father's residence, Macartney House, Blackheath, and it was from there that he set out for his campaign against the French in North America. After his death on the Plains of Abraham, Quebec, his body was brought to England and interred at Greenwich. The anniversary service was attended by the Royal Marine Old Comrades' Association, which paraded in the grounds of the Royal Naval College.
