WORK SCARCE AT VANCOUVER

Terrace Rancher Returns Without Securing Employment in Southern B. C. Cities.

Ranchers from northern British Columbia who go south for the purpose of getting work to tide them over the winter are returning home with the conviction that there are many thousands of men much more in need of a job than they and quite as unable to procure one. On the steamer Prince George which arrived from the south yesterday morning there was one Terrace farmer who had left his home some time ago to get his name on a southern payroll, and who was returning with a first hand conception of the unemployment problem as it is found in Vancouver.

"I found," he told a Daily News representative, "that there were hundreds who needed work worse than I do and who did not have any ranch to fall back upon. I decided to come home and let the other fellow take anything there was going."

This rancher had just picnicked further land under the soldiers' land settlement and stated that the government had treated him well and the plan was evidently a good one.

Terrace farmers expect to have a new market next season for their strawberries in the town of Hyder, which is now in the spotlight.

Questioned concerning the desirability of co-operative buying and selling the passenger stated that the wholesalers bucked such plans as the retailers would immediately agitate against the cutting down of their business. He admitted, however, that should the big concerns not raise the prices on them as they had done in the case of a store that had been started at Terrace the idea of banding together was one more step toward the ideal.

It is rumored that the Merchants Bank of Canada is to open a branch here in the near future. This will make three banks here, which is more than at any other point between Prince Rupert and Edmonton. The other two are the Canadian Bank of Commerce and the Royal Bank of Canada.

A meeting of the Vanderhoof Citizens Committee was held here last week. Among the questions discussed were commercial fishing in the Stuart and Nechako rivers, town fire protection, contour survey of that part of town north of the railroad and special mileage rates over the C. N. R. from Vancouver. R. C. McCorkell stated that if these rates could be obtained it would make a saving over the Prince Rupert route. The Vancouver Board of Trade has been written to asking them to bring the matter before the Dominion Railway Commission.

CHINESE MASONS IN VICTORIA

Holding All Week Session Which Commenced on Sunday Last.

VICTORIA, Dec. 18.—High dignitaries of Chinese Freemasonry are holding one of the most important conventions which they have held in North America, and the Fisgard Street headquarters of the Victoria lodge have been specially decorated for the session, which will last all the week, the large convention hall being filled with art treasures.

They are in all over a hundred delegates to the convention, and many items of business left over from the last convention held in San Francisco some two years ago, are being settled here.

The main subjects in hand are concerned with the closer cooperation of Chinese Freemasonry with the work of the world-wide Free and Accepted Masons.

Representatives of the various Victoria Masonic lodges attended the opening ceremonies, and the banquet which took place last evening, when the famous hospitality of the Chinese was seen at its best. Civic and Government officials also attended.

While the majority of the delegates are from British Columbia centres, representatives of the order are present from New York, Chicago, Montreal, Toronto, St. Louis and practically all the large cities of Canada and the United States. Cuba is also represented.

The Grand Master in Canada is Mar Yen Yuen, a resident of Victoria for the past 45 years, whose 74 years sit lightly on his shoulders.

One of the distinguished guests of the convention is Ho Leong, the Chinese consul at Vancouver.
