VANCOUVER, March 28:-Detective David Maxwell of the Burnaby police was critically injured and is now in Peace Parley at Shanghai Still in hospital following four bullets being fired at him by William Bagley, jailbreaker, bank robber and all around bad man, late Saturday night in the Burnaby woods. Bagley escaped but the police are hot on the trail of the notorious desperado, who is under sentence of

14 years' imprisonment for robbing the Harrison Hot Springs Hotel last spring. Prior to the battle with Bagley, Gordon Fawcett, fourth of the party of five who made their getaway from Okalla Prison on January 3 last, was recaptured. Three

Bagley after Game Warden W. Cameron had been taken captive by the two men in Burnaby and his car stolen. Police officers spotted the car in Vancouver and arrested Gordon Fawcett. In the car was found four hundred rounds of ammunition, a rifle, revolver, pistol and nitro-glycerine.

After his capture, Cameron was held captive in the bush by Bagley who stayed behind when Fawcett drove into the city. Bagley later tied Cameron up and left him, using Cameron's police badge. Bagley then got R. Chesney to drive him into town.

Suspicions were aroused and the police were telephoned. Detective Maxwell, with Harry Royal, took up the pursuit and finally forced the car into the curb. Bagley fired at Royal and missed but hit Maxwell four times. Bagley fled in Royal's car which was later found abandoned in Vancouver.
