

Holiday Indefinitely Extended by President Under Proclamation Issued Last Night

WASHINGTON, March 10:-A presidential proclamation kept rigid restrictions clamped tightly today about the operations of United States banks until many of them can reopen. Less than two hours before the restrictions would have become lifted at midnight last night, President Roosevelt used the power Congress had just given him by extending the bank holiday "until further proclamation."

The effect of the proclamation is that for the time being the banks can do only what they have been doing the last few days that is enough business to prevent food shortages or to keep people from going without wage pay.




