U.S Fishing Boats Being Released When They Are Overhauled

Have Been Tied up at Digby Island For Nearly Three Years and Legality of Seizure Was Confirmed By Courts

The four confiscated United States trolling boats seized the summer of 1930 and since that time held by the Marine Department at Digby Island are being overhauled prior to release to their former owners.

The boats were seized on charges of being illegally in Canadian waters. The president of the Trolling Vessel
