ANYOX, Feb. 2:- The strike which will eventually tie up the big plant of the Granby Company here started yesterday when all underground workers quit. The tie-up at the mine was complete. All surface men were also out. Tomorrow all workers at the smelter concentrating mill and coke ovens will quit when the graveyard shift comes off at 8 a.m. All surface workers in-#-----

cluding machine shops, electric HANNA IN shops, etc., are expected to also join the strikers. Over one thousand men are affected.

Eighteen policemen have been brought in from outsied points but verything is quiet so far.
