

# Hospital Lotteries Are Approved by Red Chamber by 31 to 24

Senator A. D. McRae's Measure Now Goes to House of **Commons Where it is Also Expected to be Passed** 

OTTAWA, April 6: (CP)-The bill to legalize hospital sweepstakes received its third reading in the Senate yesterday by a vote of 31 to 24 and now goes to the House of Commons where it is also expected to be passed. The bill is sponsored by Senator A. D. McRae of Vancouver and has received the general endorsation of hospitals throughout Canada. Some of the clergy and others have opposed it.

Similar replies were received to telegrams sent by the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce and Prince Rupert Retail Merchants' Ass'n., intimating that it had been only tentatively planned to carry out the work on the steamer Prince Rupert here and that southern yards had tendered lower for the work than Prince Rupert.

Presumably the work is to be done at a private yard in Vancouver.

The Canadian National has a dry dock of its own at Prince Rupert and it is claimed that it is opcrated at a loss because there is not sufficient business to pay the overhead.

There is probably no other business in the world that would take being given for comparison, has work away from its own yard and allow a rival business firm to do the work while their own plant is

If it were true that the work could not be done efficiently at the Prince Rupert yard, there might be some reason for the action of the company. As it is, there is nothing but an excuse.

Prince Rupert people will now realize that all the talk of conducting the affairs of the railway on a businesslike basis is talk and nothing more. The taking of the Prince Rupert to be overhauled at a rival establishment is a glaring example of poor business methods.
