VICTORIA, Aug. 3- In fixing midnight of August 25 as the last day for halibut fishing in Areas and 2 in the north Pacific, as announced yesterday, J. P. Babcock. chairman of the international fisheries commission explained that the fishermen themselves have been unable to reach an agreement by which they would limit and spread their catch over a longer period into the autumn. If it becomes clear that the tonnage limit has not been reached by the date set, another date may be ordered.
