LONDON, Feb. 7.—Two cardinals and at least 40 bishops will attend the laying of the foundation stone of the new Catholic Cathedral at Liverpool, which is to take place on Whit Monday. Four acres of the site on Brownlow Hill, where once stood a great gloomy poorhouse, have been cleared. Sir Edwin Lutyens, architect of the new cathedral, has designed a magnificent altar, which will be used not only at the laying of the foundation stone, but will serve for years after until it is eventually replaced by the high altar of the cathedral.

Pope Will Light Cross on Height

FLORENCE, Italy, Feb. 8.—The top of the "holy mountain" la Verna, is to be the site of an iron cross 40 feet high that will be illuminated for the first time by the pope from the vatican as one of the observances of the holy year the pontiff has promulgated beginning next April 2. His Holiness, probably on Easter night, will press a button in the vatican which will send out a signal through the vatican radio to a receiving station on the mountain. This will complete a circuit and light the lamps studding the cross. Persons dozens of miles away will be able to see the spectacle.
