Canada Should Not Experiment With Her Industries---Bennett

As Fifth Exporting Nation of World, This Country's Very Life Depends on Export Trade, Premier Tells **Ottawa Board of Trade**

OTTAWA, Sept. 1: (CP)-Canada cannot afford to imitate United States in all phases of the national recovery program, Premier R. B. Bennett told Ottawa Board of Trade members here last night. As the fifth exporting nation of the world, Canada's very life depended upon her export trade, the Premier said. In this she encountered competition of highly specialized,

highly industrialized and highly ef-ficient nations. If the country was to continue to compete, it could not afford to experiment with shorter hours of work and higher rates of pay, Mr. Bennett stated. Nevertheless, he did not intend to let the standard of living be lowered.

tecture and lighting effects. One thing that interested him much was the pageant of transportation showing the growth of methods of travel since the earliest days. It was not expected that the fair would be a financial success. Only nine million people had visited it so far which was far short of expectations. He had driven to the Fair in his car which was parked along with 18,000 others a mile from the rounds which were reached in a bus. The grounds were three miles long and a mile and a half wide but they were crowded when 300,000 conle attended at one time. The cost of the exhibit was estiated at \$250,000,000. The hall of science also was a most elaborate affair a mile long. He had visited the Royal Scot which was located longside the most modern American train and it was interesting to isten to the comments on either.
