RELATIONS BETWEEN POWERS TENSE

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA HAS WORST STORM IN YEARS

Austria, Jugo-Slavia Still At Outs After Marseilles Killings

Belgrade Charges Its Neighbor With Harboring International Terrorists Such as Those Who Assassinated Alexander and Barthou

BELGRADE, Nov. 19.—Relations between Jugo-Slavia and Austria are still strained, it is reported in official quarters here. Jugo-Slavia charges Austria with harboring international terrorists such as those who recently assassinated King Alexander and Foreign Minister Louis Barthou of France. Feeling against Austria has been strong in Jugo-Slavia since that incident.

DEATH OF CARDINAL GASPARRI

Former Papal Secretary of State Was Noted, Besides Church Work, For Peace Efforts

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 19: (CP)—Cardinal Pietro Gasparri, for sixteen years Papal Secretary of State and one of the outstanding leaders of the Roman Catholic Church in the world, died last night from pneumonia. He was eighty-two years of age. He had been ill since last Wednesday and, over the week-end, it was realized that he could not recover. Extreme unction was administered three times before he finally passed away. Besides his great work in behalf of the Roman Catholic Church, Cardinal Gasparri was noted for his efforts in the cause of universal peace—in the church and among the nations of the world.

DEATH OF FILM MAN

Willard Mack, Noted Canadian-born Author, Director and Actor, Passes Away

BEVERLY HILLS, Cal., Nov. 19: (CP)—Willard Mack, aged 54, Canadian-born playwright-actor, died last night. He was the author and director of many notable films. Mack was married four times, each time to an actress.

ICE THIN; DROWNED

Twelve-Year Old Son of Superintendent of Pioneer Mine Loses Life at Bridge River

VANCOUVER, Nov. 19: (CP)—In the first skating fatality of the season reported from Bridge River, Arthur Schultz, 12-year old son of Paul Schultz, superintendent of the Pioneer mine, was drowned Sunday when he broke through thin ice on a lake near the mine.

Rt. Rev. G. A. Rix D.D., Bishop of Caledonia, visited Metlakatla at the end of the week and yesterday conducted special Thanksgiving services. On Saturday night, the Bishop gave a moving picture display of scenes and work in the diocese, this proving of much interest to the audience.

WARNING TO GOVT

United States Chamber of Commerce Urges Administration to Try to Balance Budget

NEW YORK, Nov. 19:—The United States Chamber of Commerce has sounded a warning to the administration against continuing to embark headlong upon huge expenditures without making adequate provision to meet them. The importance of some attempt being made to balance the national budget is urged.

Stephen Golder Dies in South

Well Known World Traveller, Journalist and Philatelist Passes Away

VANCOUVER, Nov. 19: (CP)—Stephen Golder, world traveller, journalist, philatelist and once an outstanding athlete, died here suddenly yesterday. Although his exact age is unknown, he was said to be well past seventy. Golder's chief interest was in stamps and in recent years he became one of the best known collectors, his clients being world-wide. Golder came to Vancouver 25 years ago.

TROLLERS DEMAND THAT UNIVERSITY HEADS BE "FIRED"

VANCOUVER, Nov. 19: (CP)—The British Columbia Trollers' Association, at its annual meeting Saturday night, passed a resolution demanding the dismissal of Dean R. W. Brock and Prof. H. F. Angus from the faculty of the University of British Columbia because of their efforts with a view to giving the vote to Canadian-born Orientals. A query will be sent to Premier Bennett asking why Dr. W. A. Found, deputy minister of fisheries, was unable to attend the association meeting after the date had been revised to suit him. Dr. Found is at present in British Columbia.

UNABLE TO COMPROMISE

Preliminary Naval Disarmament Discussions Beginning to Look Like Failure

LONDON, Nov. 19:—Hope of Great Britain being able to effect a compromise agreement between United States and Japan at preliminary naval disarmament discussions here appears to be definitely fading. Statements issued by Prime Minister J. Ramsay MacDonald of Great Britain and Norman H. Davis, chief of the American delegation, indicate that the two countries have agreed that there can be no naval parity for Japan which sticks to her guns in demand for naval equality with Great Britain and the United States. Unless an agreement is reached, it is feared that the greatest naval building race in history may ensue. Following Japan's definite refusal to accept the British compromise, British and American delegates were in conference over the week-end with a view to formulating a new plan.

Walter Beck Is Taken Over By Mission Reds

BROOKLYN, Nov. 19:—The management of the Brooklyn National League baseball club announces that the sale of Pitcher Walter Beck to the Missions of the Pacific Coast League has been completed. Beck has been with the Missions since last year.

Estimate of Fishermen's Earnings Much Discussed; Printed Figures Too High

Estimates published here and in Vancouver last week as to the possible earnings of fishermen of this coast during the past season have caused a great deal of discussion in fishing circles. It was stated this morning by a local man closely in touch with the halibut fleet that the average for the halibut fishermen for the short season might have been \$800 but would be no higher than this figure.

WARNING BY CHURCHILL

Declares That Germany is Still Actively Fostering Spirit of Warfare—No Hope of Peace

LONDON, Nov. 19:—Rt. Hon. Winston Churchill, former Chancellor of the Exchequer, speaking at the week-end, declared that Great Britain might just as well give up the idea of peace being maintained for long in Europe. Germany, a short air journey from England, he asserted, was actively entertaining the idea of war and was menacing Europe with conflict. In that country, he declared, war was still considered a glorious exercise and death on the field of battle man's greatest destiny.

Wind, Rain and Snow Cause Eight Deaths In Southern State

Five Lose Lives in Automobiles and Three Drowned When Boat Capsizes in San Francisco Bay—Forty Cars Snowed in in Sierras

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 19: (CP)—Northern California was slowly recovering today from one of the worst storms in years. Wind, rain and snow caused eight deaths. Five were killed in automobile accidents and three drowned when a squall capsized a fishing boat in San Francisco Bay. Forty automobiles were snowed in high up in the Sierra Mountains.

CHILD LOST BY MOTHER

Decision in New York Custody Case Reported to Have Gone Against Mrs. Vanderbilt

NEW YORK, Nov. 19:—Although Judge Carewe stated that no decision would be rendered in the case before today, and possibly later, newspapermen learned at the week-end that Mrs. Gloria Vanderbilt had lost out in the legal fight for custody of her 10-year old daughter, Gloria. It was stated that the court had decided to award custody of the child to her aunt, Mrs. Harry Payne Whitney, deciding that, owing to the life the mother had led, she was unfit to keep the child. When the child becomes fourteen years of age, she may decide with whom she shall remain. Meantime, the aunt shall have custody, the mother being permitted to see the child on only two days a week—Saturdays and Sundays. Immediately the formal decision is announced, Mrs. Vanderbilt will appeal the case to higher courts, it is intimated.

KILLED IN CAR CRASH

Member of Well Known Fernie Mining Family Lost Life Late Saturday Night

FERNIE, Nov. 19: (CP)—Stafford Wilson, superintendent of the Morrissey, Fernie & Michel Railway and son of W. R. Wilson, president of the Crow's Nest Pass Coal Co., was killed at midnight Saturday when an automobile plunged through a bridge into T. Zard Creek, three miles west of here. R. W. Wilson, prominently identified with mining in the Smithers district, is a brother of deceased.

John May Badly Hurt in Storage Plant Accident

John May, timekeeper at the plant of the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co., sustained a fractured pelvis and possible internal injuries in an accident at 11:30 Saturday morning in the fish shed of the cold storage plant when he was caught under a heavy weight of herring bait pans which fell upon him as he happened to be passing. He was immediately rushed to the Prince Rupert General Hospital where he was reported today to be resting as easily as could be expected.

INCOME TO BE TAXED

Plan of Municipal Income Tax Is Under Consideration in New York

NEW YORK, Nov. 19:—A plan of municipal income tax is being considered by the taxation committee of the board of aldermen of New York in its efforts to find means of taking care of the enormous civic relief burden. Under the plan those earning more than \$1200 per year would be taxed on a scale of from one and a half to three percent according to the volume of their earnings. It is estimated that from \$3,000,000 to \$5,000,000 annually could be realized from such a tax.

Vanderhoof Man Dies Suddenly

Late William Henry Matheson Was Brother of Professor at University of B. C.

Divisional headquarters of the provincial police here have received report of the sudden death from natural causes on November 5 of William Henry Matheson, 70-year old rancher of the Vanderhoof district and brother of Prof. E. G. Matheson of the University of British Columbia. Deceased had been farming outside of Vanderhoof since the Great War in which he served. He was unmarried.
