ORIENTAL SITUATION AGAIN OMINOUS FEARFUL OF GERMANY, FRANCE INCREASES WAR BUDGET

Further Sino-Japanese Hostilities Imminent In Manchukuo Region

Chinese Resist Ultimatum—Naval Building Campaign Started by Flowery Kingdom as Naval Parley Faces Breakdown—Great Britain Fearful

PEIPING, China, Nov. 20.—Bloody fighting, with heavy casualties, is already reported to have broken out as Japanese troops spread out from Manchukuo. The Japanese have delivered an ultimatum to the Chinese, it is stated here, to evacuate certain communities and the Chinese are resisting. While Japan states that the intention is to settle the Manchukuo border once and for all, it is contended here that the campaign shows all the signs of the former Japanese aggressiveness when Manchukuo was carved out of Chinese Manchuria in defiance of the League of Nations.

VICTORIA, Nov. 20: (CP)—C. J. Dowell, member of the Board of Industrial Relations, was nominated liberal candidate for the federal seat of Victoria last night. D'arcy B. Bennett is the sitting Conservative member.

SEVERE EARTHQUAKE IN NORTHERN INDIA

PASHAWAR, India, Nov. 20:—The northwest portion of India was shaken Sunday with one of the most severe earthquakes in years. It is feared that there was heavy loss of life and extensive damage. According to meagre reports reaching here, the people are in a state of panic.

Treaty Is Denounced

LONDON, Nov. 20:—Following Japan's decision to flatly reject the British compromise plan at the preliminary naval disarmament conversations which would give Japan equality in naval strength with Great Britain and United States in principle but not in practice, it was stated here yesterday that the Tokio government had decided to denounce the London naval treaty but would await a more auspicious occasion before formally announcing so.

In view of the unsettled situation in the East, it is reported here that Great Britain is about to send an additional squadron of bombing planes to Singapore for use in the Orient in case of emergency.

Launching New Cruiser

TOKIO, Nov. 20:—Emperor Hirohito today viewed the launching of a new battle cruiser which is said to be one of the most powerful fighting craft on the seas. Construction of a new aircraft carrier for Japan is understood to have started and a new flotilla of destroyers is about to be built, it is said.

FOUR DIE IN CRASH

Lost Lives Instantly When Commercial Plane Wrecked Near San Fernando, Cal.

SAN FERNANDO, Cal., Nov. 20:—A pilot and three other persons were instantly killed in the crash of a commercial airplane near here Saturday. The fuel supply had been cut off before the crash occurred so the plane did not take fire.

IS GOING TO JURY

Insult Case of Using Mails to Defraud May Conclude in Chicago This Week

CHICAGO, Nov. 20:—The case in which Samuel Insull, former utilities magnate, and sixteen co-defendants are charged with using the mails to defraud is expected to go to the jury this week, possibly today, after a trial lasting several weeks.

The prosecution late Saturday rested its case in rebuttal and the defence presented sub-rebuttal yesterday.

Judge Wilkerson on Saturday refused a petition of the defence to direct a verdict for the acquittal of eleven of the co-defendants, five of whom have appeared as witnesses. The petition was to be renewed today.

With Olof Hanson M.P. having been renominated as Liberal candidate a few months back and the Conservative outlook uncertain, probably pending some indication being given as to when the contest will take place, present speculation in regard to the forthcoming federal election fight in Skeena riding centres in the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation. Little has been heard from the C. C. F. of late despite the fact that a nominating convention has been called for December 7. Some of the district C. C. F. clubs have already named their delegates but the clubs in the city will not do so until after November 20.

STRIKE IS THREATENED

Street Railway Workers in Los Angeles May Walk Out Unless Wage Demands Met

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 20:—Unless the company meets their demands for an eight-hour day and five-day week with some wage increases, 2500 street railway workers of this city are threatening to go out on strike on Wednesday. Noon of that day has been set as the deadline for the walk-out. Some hope, however, is held of a settlement being made in the meantime.

Economic Nationalism And National Arming Deplored By Former Canada Premier

MONTREAL, Nov. 20: (CP)—Despite increasing evidence of recovery in Canada and abroad, lack of exchange stability still aggravates the return of normal international trade, declared Sir Robert Borden in his presidential address at the annual meeting of Barclay's Bank of Canada.

Sir Robert also scored economic nationalism and increasing expenditures on national armaments by many nations as constituting unnecessary brakes on the world's painful climb back to prosperity.

European Nations Are Still Preparing For Conflict Year Hence

Paris Has Now Set Aside \$376,000,000 For Military Purposes Next Year, Having Increased Amount By \$53,000,000 Yesterday

PARIS, Nov. 20: (CP)—France increased its budget today by \$53,000,000 after hearing a warning from the budget committee that Germany could put an army of 5,500,000 men into the field next year. In a few months, reports said, Germany would be stronger on land than in 1914. The war budget of France for next year now totals \$376,000,000.

BAD CHECK SENT BACK FROM HERE

G. H. Richards of London, Ont., Goes to Jail on Fraud And Uttering Charges

TORONTO, Nov. 20: (CP)—G. H. Richards of London, Ont., convicted on two charges of fraud and uttering, was today sentenced to six months determinate imprisonment and one year indeterminate in the Ontario reformatory.

Richards presented a check for \$335 drawn on the Prince Rupert branch of the Royal Bank of Canada to a bank in Mount Denis, a suburb of Toronto. It came back "N.S.F."

CHAIN STORE CAPITAL INCREASED TEN TIMES

OTTAWA, Nov. 20: (CP)—The complex financial structure of Loblaw Groceries Limited, which in 1921 had an original capital of \$480,000 in common and preferred issues but now has developed through a series of intricate financial operations to an invested capital of \$5,500,000, was disclosed before the mass buying and price spreads commission today.

JAIL FOR THIEVING

Three Vancouver Men Sentenced To Terms in New Westminster Penitentiary

VANCOUVER, Nov. 20: (CP)—Edward J. Van Balkom and Ray Simmons who pleaded guilty to seven charges of retaining stolen goods, were each sentenced to three years' imprisonment in penitentiary in police court here this morning.

George Woods, pleading guilty to eleven charges, was given two years' imprisonment.

Police state that already \$15,000 worth of the stolen goods has been recovered.

#### MR. BENNETT'S POSITION

A correspondent wants to know what is the position of Premier Bennett in relation to President Beatty's campaign to bring about the absorption of the Canadian National Railways into the Canadian Pacific system, involving the abandonment of something like five thousand miles of railway of which sixty-six percent would be Canadian National.

Our reply is that we do not know but we can tell him what was the Prime Minister's attitude in 1930 as expressed in a speech made by him in the city of Winnipeg from which the following paragraph is taken:

"I say to you that no man in this country rejoices more in the strength and progress of the Canadian National Railways than I, made possible as it was in the first instance by the genius of our own statesmen and by the passing of legislation by our party. But more, every effort of mine after July 28 will be for one purpose. That purpose is not only to preserve the identity of the Canadian National Railways as a publicly owned competitor of a private enterprise, but to see that it serves even better and more effectively the Canadian people, who are so proud of it."

Spent Much Time in South in Connection With Hemlock Shipments—Still Working

Evidently Olof Hanson M.P. was a busy man while in the south. He is a little reluctant to tell of what he did or what success attended his efforts but he admits that he interviewed the H. R. MacMillan Company and the Capilano Timber Company at Vancouver in connection with the proposal to ship hemlock logs through Prince Rupert and also went into the whole question at length with the heads of the Dollar Line at Seattle.

Speaking of the prospects before leaving for Smithers last evening, Mr. Hanson said they were making progress. What they wanted was to put the log export on a business basis so that the producer could get the best possible price for his logs. Also the logs had to be shipped from Prince Rupert, following out the regulations laid down by the government at Victoria. On the whole the outlook was good although there was a great deal more to do before they could begin to cut logs.

Mr. Hanson will be here again this week and, in the meantime, he is in constant communication with the south and is hopeful that success will attend the efforts.
