Paris Has Now Set Aside \$376,000,000 For Military Purposes Next Year, Having Increased Amount By \$53,000,000 Yesterday

PARIS, Nov. 20: (CP)-France increased its budget today by \$53,000,000 after hearing a warning from the budget committee that Germany could put an army of 5,-500,000 men into the field next year. In a few months, reports said, Germany would be stronger on land than in 1914. The war budget of France for next year now totals \$376,000,000.
