# TOO HIGH

Railway Taxation Commissioner Presents Case to Court of Revision-Other Appeals

R. R. Nichol, assistant taxation commissioner for the Canadian National Railways, submitted this morning to City Commissioner W. J. Alder, sitting as a court of revision on the municipal assessment roll for 1934, that railway property here had been overvaluated in comparison with the assessment placed on private property generally in the city. Whereas the assessments on private property had dropped some forty percent in the last few years, railway property valuations had been reduced only about twenty percent. Further, Mr. Nichol contended, assessed values of railway property were out of all proportion to services rendered.

After Mr. Nichol's representations had been heard, the commissioner proceeded to hear appeals from many owners of private property or their representatives, there being ovr eighty appeals on the list. The court adjourned before noon until 2:30 this afternoon.


