# TRAGEDY IS FEARED AT EGG ISLAND

## Provincial Minister of Finance Announces Plan To Refund Entire Indebtedness of This Province at Three Percent Interest LABOR IS

"ENDEAVOR TO PREVENT DEFAULT ON INTER-EST PAYMENT" IS POLICY OF GOVERNMENT. HON. JOHN HART TELLS LEGISLATURE IN IM-PORTANT DOCUMENT TODAY.

### Expected to Save Five Million Annually Under Conversion Loan

NO NEW TAXATION PROPOSED-MEAL IMPOST IS ABOLISHED AND EXEMPTION GIVEN ON ONE PERCENT TAX-INCOME EXEMPTIONS ARE ALSO TO BE RAISED.

VICTORIA, March 12: (CP)-Hon. John Hart, minister of finance, declared a policy of "endeavor to prevent default in payment of interest" in his budget speech today. He asked for power to refund at lower rates of interest practically the entire debt of the province. Proposed refunding of \$124,426,000 is based upon the assumption that the money markets will offer favorable opportunities to carry it out.

It is proposed that the refunding be at rates of three or three and one-half percent for a term of thirty years and that sufficient sinking funds be set up after a period of five years to liquidate the debt at maturity.

Mr. Hart estimates that such refunding will save the taxpayers some six million dollars annually for the first five years and some three million dollars annually for succeeding years.

The scheme would not be carried out in one large transaction but from time to time as favorable opportunity offered.

The minister of finance said that the Dominion government had been requested to guarantee the conversion loan but had declined.

A deficit of \$2,066,846 on current account is budgetted for in addition to which there will be an estimated deficit of some three million dollars on relief account.

#### NO NEW TAXATION

There is no new taxation. The meal tax is abolished. The one percent taxes on wages will not be collected from persons receiving less than \$50 per month.

Under income tax single men are given exemption of |ril 12, 1932. \$600 and married persons \$1000.

Extra funds are provided for teachers' salary grants. The University of British Columbia gets an extra \$50,000. The Succession Duty Act will be re-enacted without increase in rates.

#### AID TO MUNICIPALITIES

While grants to municipalities will not be increased, the government has made arrangements to loan to municipalities their share of unemployment relief during the present year.

The budget shows a reduction in expenditure of more than \$1,000,000 with revenue decreased by about the same amount.

A reduction of nearly \$2,500,000 is shown under capital expenditure due to the fact that no provision is made for sinking fund installments.

Walter James Flewin had been put ashore at Egg Island from the Newington to assist MacDonald during Moran's absence. He was the son of John Flewin, formerly of Port Simpson and now of Victoria.

Daniel MacDonald, a native of Invernesshire, Scotland, had been a resident of this district for 25 years, being well known in the city. Formerly a miner, he had been located at Anyox and also in the Cariboo. At one time he was a mail a car driver in Vancouver. He had, in the lighthouse service about three months.

Having been delayed by the stop at Egg Island, the Catala arrived in port at 8:30 last night from the south and sailed at 10 p.m. for Anyox, Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here tomorrow morning and sail south at 1:30 p.m.
